OVERVIEW OF SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS

- ▶ Proposition 39
- ▶ Water Conservation projects
- ▶ Scheduled Maintenance projects
- ▶ Central Plant and Infrastructure
- ▶ Johnson Student Center
- ▶ Science Center

PROP 39 PROJECTS

- ▶ Energy Management Systems (EMS) upgrade at Santa Ana College (15 buildings), Digital Media Center and Orange County Sheriff's Regional Training Academy. This project will reduce campus energy consumption and reduce maintenance costs.
- ▶ Work has commenced at Santa Ana College on February 13, 2017.
- ▶ Buildings E, G, I, L, M, V are ongoing.
- ▶ Training on the new equipment will commence late April 2017.



WATER CONSERVATION PROJECTS

- ▶ SCC – campus wide irrigation controller replacement – project commenced February 23, 2017 and is anticipated to be completed end of June 2017.
- ▶ SAC – campus wide irrigation controller replacement in order to maximize water efficiency and to provide a single system with control from M&O Office. Project is in planning phase.

PROJECT	STATUS	ESTIMATED BUDGET
Lighting Contact/Relays (D, H, L, R, T)	This project is currently in construction in conjunction with the Proposition 39 year 4 EMS building upgrade project. Target completion is June 30, 2017.	\$61,123
Window Replacement (H)	Submitted to DSA on March 31, 2017. Anticipated DSA approval October 2017. A schedule for implementation of work is under review with the College.	\$351,129
Water Conservation	Ongoing coordination with the Central Plant design team to review locations of controllers to be installed. Bid documents being developed, for an anticipated release June 2017. This project is planned in conjunction with the Water Conservation 15-16 project.	\$27,748 (under review)
