Corine Doughty Named Dean of Business and Career Technical Education at Santiago Canyon College

(Santa Ana)—Rancho Santiago Community College District (RSCCD) has named Corine Doughty as dean of Business and Career Technical Education at Santiago Canyon College. As dean, Doughty leads and administers all aspects of the division including the design, delivery, staffing, administrative support, supervision and evaluation of academic programs and academic and support staff, as well as student enrollment, evaluation, assistance and discipline.

The division includes the following programs: accounting, business management, marketing, computer science, finance, apprenticeship, code enforcement academy, project management, gemology, human development, public works, real estate, survey and mapping science, water utility science and more.

Doughty has over 13 years of administrative management experience, including seven years as a director in the community college system. Most recently, she served as director of Career and Community Education for Orange Coast College. In that role, she was responsible for more than \$2 million in state and federal grants, coordinated all Perkins IV funding for campus Career Technical Education (CTE), oversaw new CTE development and program revisions. From 2005 to 2008, she served as director of Community Services and Contract Education for Rio Hondo Community College.

Previously, she served as regional director of education and training for Coldwell Banker Residential Brokerage. Prior to that, she served as director of the Workplace Learning Resource Center for North Orange County Community College District’s School of Continuing Education. Earlier, Doughty was program manager for North Orange County Regional Occupational Program’s Career Development Center.

Doughty holds an M.A. in counseling psychology from Pepperdine University and a B.A. in psychology from Chapman University. She also earned a Certificate in Human Resource Management from University of California, Irvine, Extension.
