

Santa Ana College School of Continuing Education ESL Program Satisfaction Survey (Fall 2008)

December 2008

In a continuing effort to assess and improve the English as a Second Language (ESL) Program, its administrators and faculty administered a survey to find out why ESL students come to school, what their needs are, and how satisfied students are with the program that is offered at Santa Ana College's School of Continuing Education. The survey was administered in classes at three sites: Centennial Education Center (CEC), Market Education Center (MEC) and Santa Ana High School (SAHS). 766 students responded to this survey and below are their assessment of the program.

Summary of Findings

Overall, most respondents are very satisfied with the ESL program. Most respondents (97%) have attended classes at SAC School of Continuing Education fewer than two years. More than half of respondents are female (55%) and slightly more than two-thirds are under 30 years of age (67%). Many respondents (81%) have completed below an 8th grade education in their native language.

- 27% of the respondents who have not met with a counselor, but indicated that they would like to see one.
- CEC's respondents rated "excellent" or "good" the quality of instruction (95%), the classroom learning experience, the availability of classes, books and learning experience (93% each).
- At MEC the quality of instruction received the highest ratings of "excellent" or "good" (97%) followed by overall experience (96%) and classroom learning experience (95%).
- SAHS's respondents rated "excellent" or "good" the classroom learning experience (96%), books and learning materials (96%) and quality of instruction (95%).
- More than half (52%) of all respondents come to school to learn English and 29% because they want to help their children with their school work.
- Many respondents are also interested in enrolling in ABE and parent education courses.
- More than half (56%) of all respondents stated that they "sometime" use the language skills learned in school.
- The most important skills respondents learned in their class were reading (41%) at CEC, speaking (48%) at MEC, writing (61%) at SAHS.
- Three-quarters of CEC's respondents and more than half of MEC's respondents agreed that they need more help with their speaking skill.

Attached are detailed responses for the all students (n=766) who responded to the survey, as well as data separated by the three sites (CEC, MEC and SAHS) in which the survey was administered.
