

## Santa Ana College Does Curriculum Change in Selected English/EMLS Courses Enhance Successful Course Completion?

In Fall 2007, faculty implemented a curriculum change that requires students enrolled in English N60, 061 and EMLS 112 to spend an additional 16 hours a semester outside of class time in the Writing Center. In addition to faculty providing structured instruction during these sessions, the students are also welcomed to bring their composition for individualized tutoring. Faculty believes that if students have the additional one-on-one assistance, they can easily identify their writing errors and develop the skills needed to correct them. After three years, faculty wants to know if the changes influence the success rates of those enrolled in these courses. Findings include:

- Students enrolled in English N60 and EMLS 112 showed minor changes in successful course completion rates compared to those enrolled in the courses prior to the curriculum changes (Fall 2006).
- Students enrolled in English 061 for the last three fall semesters were more successful (an average of five percentage points) than those enrolled Fall 2006.

There may be other intervening variables that faculty should consider when assessing the impact that participation in the Writing Center has on students' success in these three courses; further investigation is recommended.
