

Enrollment Management Summary 2006

Compiled by the RSCCD Research Department, September 2006

Summary of Headcount at RSCCD Colleges (see Table 1)

- Overall, headcounts in the district (at census) increased 17% since Fall 2005.
 - SAC headcount increased 18%.
 - SCC headcount increased 13%.
- Headcounts in **traditional on-campus** programs increased 4% (excluding apprenticeship, fire and criminal justice academies, contract management, quality assurance, business seminar, and distance education courses (television and online)).
 - SAC headcount increased 3%.
 - SCC headcount increased 7%.

Summary of Feeder High School Graduates who Matriculate to RSCCD Colleges (see Table 2)

- Overall, the rate of feeder high school graduates who matriculate to SAC and SCC has changed little since 2002 (29% to 34%).
 - The rate of OUSD students who enroll at SAC and SCC has remained fairly constant since 2002 (34% to 37%).
 - The rate of SAUSD students who enroll at SAC and SCC has increased since 2002 (34% to 45%).

Summary of Graduates at Feeder High Schools (see Table 3)

- > Overall, the number of graduates from RSCCD colleges' feeder high schools increased 1% from 2005 to 2006.
 - The number of 2006 **OUSD graduates increased 9%** over the number of 2005 graduates.
 - The number of 2006 **SAUSD graduates decreased 13%** over the number of 2005.

Summary of Feeder High Schools of New Freshmen at RSCCD Colleges (see Table 4)

- The number of new freshmen at SAC who graduated from SAUSD high schools fell 4% (from 2005 to 2006); SAUSD graduates attending SCC fell 19%.
 - The greatest decrease was from Santa Ana Valley High School (94 freshmen).
- The number of new freshmen at SCC who graduated from OUSD high schools increased 12% (from 2005 to 2006); there was a 28% increase in OUSD graduates attending SAC for the first time.
- There was an over 20% increase in the number of new freshmen who graduated from high schools outside our district boundaries, but within Orange County (22% at SAC and 21% at SCC).

Program-by-Program Comparisons of Enrollments (Tables 5a, 5b, and 6)

- The largest increases in enrollments at SAC was in fire academy (n=3822) and business seminars coursework (n=539).
- The largest increases in enrollments at SCC were in math (n=528) and English (n=513).
- > Overall, distance education course enrollment (online and television delivery) increased 18%.
 - At SAC, distance education enrollments increased 15%; at SCC, 26%.
