## Background of Study

Since 1993, we have sought to identify and track academic progress of students enrolled in college credit coursework who had previously been enrolled in the School of Continuing Education (CE). During the almost two decades of this ongoing study SAC's credit and noncredit programs have, at times, shared a common track in student record-keeping practices, interrupted periodically by migrations to new systems by one school or the other. While these variations have presented great challenges to continuity, we believe that the overall trends we are able to identify provide a valuable means by which to gain insight into the educational path that many of our students travel.

The primary subjects of this study are those students who enrolled in the Santa Ana College School of Continuing Education and subsequently enrolled in RSCCD credit coursework.

## Summary of Findings

> Matriculants from SAC’s School of Continuing Education are predominantly Hispanic and about equal in proportions of males and females. New matriculants are, on average, 23 years of age.
$>$ Most new matriculants were enrolled in the high school subjects program in continuing education (86\%) and begin credit coursework in the fall semester (68\%).
$>$ New matriculants, on average, enroll in more units in their first semester in (about 9 units), reducing their load in subsequent semesters to an average of about 7.
$>$ Former CE students accounted for 16,275 grades in the 2010-11 school year with an overall course success rate (A,B,C, and Pass grades) of $61 \%$ (compared to $69 \%$ for the SAC student body at large).
> $86 \%$ of former CE students were advised to enroll in math coursework below college-level (below Math 105) and 70\% in English coursework below 101. All former CE students advised to take ESL, EMLS, and Reading coursework were advised into below-college courses.
