# A G R E E M E N T

## Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

**THIS AGREEMENT** is made and entered into by and between **AFFIRMA Rehabilitation, Inc.**, hereinafter called the Agency, and **Rancho Santiago Community College District on behalf of Santa Ana College**, hereinafter called the District.

### **PART I. BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT**

WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS**, the District and Agency acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education for the benefit for students and to meet community needs.

**WHEREAS**, the District provides programs in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education, which require clinical experience for students, enrolled in these programs.

**WHEREAS**, the Agency has facilities suitable for the clinical needs of the District programs in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

**WHEREAS**, it is to the benefit of both District and Agency that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have opportunities for clinical experience to enhance their capabilities as practitioners.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the District and Agency do covenant and agree as follows:

### **PART II. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE COLLEGE**

#### **A. For the Program in General**

1. The District will assume full responsibility for offering Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education programs eligible for accreditation by the appropriate State Board.
2. District faculty members may be invited to serve as voluntary resource persons to the Agency staff by serving on Occupational Therapy Assistant Program care committees, by sharing knowledge as clinical experts, and by participation in other matters dealing with the quality of patient care.
3. For Background clearance  
The District shall inform The Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students of the Background Check requirement and their responsibility of payment.

4. For Student Workmen's Compensation:  
The District shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance on students of the District during clinical assignment, and keep records of clinical attendance for audit by the State Workmen's Compensation Insurance Fund.

B. For Program Planning

1. The District will initiate the development of mutually acceptable clinical instruction plans for using the Agency's clinical areas to meet the educational goals of Occupational Therapy Assistant Program curricula. These plans will be made available to the Agency at a mutually agreed upon time prior to the beginning of the school term and subject to revision in instances of conflicts with agency patient care responsibilities and/or District interests.
2. The District has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Agency staff, including both selected Agency personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating the educational program in occupational therapy.

C. For Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Student

1. The District will be responsible for assuring that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness, and shall provide certification that the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have been immunized against the common communicable diseases.

- D. HIPAA. For purposes of this Agreement and the pertinent provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and implementing regulations, students shall be considered "work force members". As members of the workforce, students shall have access to Protected Health Information ("PHI") as defined by HIPAA and will be required to comply with all regulations governing the security and protection of PHI. Students will be required to participate in certain education and training related to security and protection of PHI, as offered by both DISTRICT and AGENCY.

**PART III. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE AGENCY**

A. For the Program in General

1. The Agency will maintain the standards, which make it eligible for approval as a clinical area for instruction in accredited Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs. To further this, the Agency agrees to provide and maintain personnel who are in its opinion, capable and qualified in those divisions in which students are placed.
2. The administration of the service and patient care at the Agency shall be the

responsibility of and under the control and supervision of the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency staff.

3. The Agency will designate a staff member who will function as Education Coordinator for Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education uses of the Agency facilities, including joint planning and representatives of all involved Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs.
4. The Agency will provide orientation for students and faculty to familiarize them with Agency policies and facilities before assigning them to duties at the Agency.
5. The Agency will permit its employees to participate in the educational program as resource persons and clinical experts provided such participation does not interfere with assigned duties.
6. The Agency will permit the faculty and students of the District to use its patient care and patient service facilities for clinical education according to approved curricula.
7. The Agency will confer with the District prior to making a commitment for new or expanded use of its clinical facilities by any other Occupational Therapy Assistant Program that interfere with current student placement.

**B. For Services and Facilities**

1. The Agency will permit the educational use of such supplies and equipment as are commonly available for patient care.
2. The Agency will permit use of the following facilities and services by District Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students and faculty at such times and to the degrees considered feasible by the agency.
  - a. Parking areas.
  - b. Locker, storage and dressing facilities.
  - c. Same food services as are available for Agency staff.
  - d. First aid treatment with written consent required for minors.
  - e. Access to sources of information for education purposes such as:
    1. Patient's chart.
    2. Procedure guides policy manuals.
    3. Medical dictionaries, pharmacology references, and other references suitable to the clinical area.
    4. Books and periodicals in the Medical library.

**C. For the Control of District Personnel**

1. The Agency may refuse access to its clinical areas to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students or district faculty who do not meet its employee standards for



safety, health, cooperation, or ethical behavior pending investigation and resolution of the matter by the Agency and the District.

**PART IV. JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES**

**A. For publications**

1. Publication by District faculty, or Agency staff members of any material relative to their clinical experience, that has not been approved for release by the District and Agency signers of this agreement, is prohibited.

**B. Insurance:**

Without limiting the indemnification obligations stated below, each party to the Agreement shall maintain and secure at its own expense comprehensive general liability, property damage insurance, and professional liability of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

**C. Indemnification**

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, students and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, students or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

**PART V. STATUS OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT STUDENTS**

**A.** Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall have the status as learners and shall not be considered to be Agency employees nor shall they replace Agency staff. Any service rendered by the student during the experience is to be considered in addition to planned patient care in that area. Clinical experience will be conducted as a laboratory learning experience. The Agency will provide regular staffing for patient care in areas where students are obtaining clinical experience.

**B.** Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students are subject to the authority, policies, and regulations of the district. They are also subject, during clinical assignment, to applicable agency regulations and must conform to the same standards as are for Agency employees in matters relating to the welfare of patients and general Agency operations.

- C. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall be responsible for proper coverage in regard to malpractice insurance, or any other liability insurance that might be required by either the District or the Agency.
- D. The District will be responsible for assuring that health care students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness.

**PART VI. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, TERMINATION**

- A. This agreement shall be effective as of the date signed, and shall continue in effect for five years, unless terminated earlier by written notice of either party. Either party to this Agreement may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party at least 30 days' prior written notice. In the event the Agreement is terminated for cause, all of the obligations of the terminating party shall be waived immediately upon written notice of termination. In the event of termination without cause, the parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations associated with the current term or semester, prior to such termination becoming effective.

**BACKGROUND**

Santa Ana College allows students to file for degree and certificate completion 3 times per year. Attached are lists comparing degrees and certificates earned for fall 2013 and fall 2014. Also attached, please find a list of students who have completed coursework at Santa Ana College leading to the Associate Degree and/or Certificate for fall 2014.

**ANALYSIS**

Santa Ana College awarded 462 Associate Degrees at the conclusion of the fall 2014 semester, 267 Associate of Arts, 28 Associate of Arts Transfer, 125 Associate in Science and 42 Associate of Science for Transfer. This is up 38 degrees from summer 2013 in which 196 Associate Degrees were conferred. The area that showed a significant increase is Business Administration for Transfer which grew from 15 degrees awarded in fall 2013 to 28 awarded in fall 2014.

Santa Ana College awarded 440 Certificates of Achievement at the conclusion of the fall 2014 semester. This is down 4 certificates over fall 2013 in which 444 Certificates of Achievement were conferred. The area with the most significant increase in certificates is Fire Technology – Public Fire Service which awarded 40 certificates. This is an increase of 32 from the 8 certificates awarded at the conclusion of fall 2013.

**BACKGROUND**

Attached is a list of students who successfully completed coursework at Santiago Canyon College leading to an associate of arts degree, associate of arts for transfer degree, associate of science degree, associate of science for transfer degree, certificate of achievement, and/or certificate of proficiency for fall 2014. Also attached are the statistical tables showing degrees and certificates awarded by major.

**ANALYSIS**

Santiago Canyon College awarded 373 associate degrees in fall 2014, as compared to 272 in fall 2013. The degree with the most significant increase is the associate of arts in Liberal Arts: Arts, Humanities and Communication. Santiago Canyon College awarded 136 associate of arts degrees in Liberal Arts: Arts, Humanities and Communication in fall 2014, as compared to 91 in fall 2013. Other degrees with a significant increase are Liberal Arts: Mathematics and Science, Liberal Arts: Social and Behavioral Sciences and associate in science for transfer degree in Business Administration. Santiago Canyon College awarded 29 associate in science for Transfer degree in Business Administration in fall 2014, as compared to 19 in fall 2013. Santiago Canyon College awarded 70 associate in arts for transfer and associate in science for transfer degrees in fall 2014, compared to 45 in fall 2013. The number of students who received multiple degrees increased dramatically. This was the most significant contribution to the increase in the number of degrees awarded. In fall 2014 there were 92 students who received two or more degrees, as compared to 53 in fall 2013.

Santiago Canyon College awarded 344 certificates of achievement in fall 2014, as compared to 594 in fall 2013. A total of 54 certificates of proficiency were awarded in fall 2014, as compared to 624 in fall 2013. Notable increases were seen in Apprenticeship Electricity: Power Lineman and in IGETC General Education Breadth. The effort of identifying students and awarding certificates for those who completed the requirements for a certificate, and had not been awarded the certificate, is complete. As a result, there is a notable decrease in the numbers of both certificates of achievement and certificates of proficiency.

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees confirm the recipients of the associate degrees and certificates for fall 2014 as presented.

On April 7, 2015, Bid #1248 was opened for the Hammond Hall project which included the removal of existing ornamental metal window shades, replacement of exterior windows and painting of the exterior of the building. **BACKGROUND:**

The Santiago Canyon College has an outdated legacy energy management system called American Automatrix which controls the HVAC and lighting systems in the buildings. The system is not able to support the vast energy efficiency programming strategies currently available. The system is unreliable and does not provide basic management capabilities for existing mechanical equipment such as scheduling, equipment trending, and alarm management. Due to the lack of functionality, the inefficiency of management has increased energy and gas use, impacted proper equipment maintenance, and degraded occupant comfort. Additionally, the American Automatrix software and hardware is proprietary with currently only one local vendor able to service the legacy system.

Currently, the building automation marketplace has changed to open-protocol non-proprietary Energy Management System (EMS) software and hardware products to allow for more HVAC control flexibility, robust energy efficiency programming strategies, inter-operateability with multiple HVAC equipment, and open competition among installers and integrators. The new open-protocol EMS software platform integrates diverse systems and devices regardless of manufacturer or communication protocol into a unified platform that can be easily managed and controlled in real time over the Internet using a standard web browser. The District prefers to have the ability to use multiple vendors in the future to service the EMS and allowing for a more robust HVAC management tool.

Southern California Edison (SCE) determined the upgrades to the EMS at Santiago Canyon College qualify for the Energy Efficiency Customized Solutions program. As part of the program, Newcomb Anderson and McCormick, consultant for Southern California Edison, provided a technical analysis of the project and concluded the project will net minimum yearly savings of 65,477 kWh and 56 therms. SCE will provide an estimated incentive of approximately \$15,713 and the annual bill savings is estimated to be reduced by \$9,865 per year. The District expects the total energy savings and annual bill savings to exceed the conservative estimate after implementation of the EMS upgrade.

**ANALYSIS:**

The project is expected to conserve energy through new and efficient HVAC control strategies managed by the new Energy Management System. Accordingly, the District has undertaken a Request for Proposal (RFP) and solicitation process utilizing a best value criteria review as defined in Public Contract Code 20133(c)(1) including compliance with Government Code 4217.10 - 4217.18. The RFP process and contracting method has been reviewed by legal counsel, Bryce Chastain.

A Request for Proposal (RFP) #1415-94 was released and advertised on March 6, 2015 and responses were due on March 31, 2015. The District received three responses from Climatec Incorporated (Irvine), Air Conditioning Control Systems, Inc. (Anaheim), and Sunbelt Controls (Glendale). A committee of three members reviewed the proposals on March 31, 2015 and interviewed the three firms on April 2, 2015. The selection and interview committee recommends Climatec Inc. by consensus based on a best value criteria, evaluation of providers, technology provided, ability to meet minimum energy savings, experience with similar size and type of projects, understanding of scope, ability to meet the schedule of completion, and the overall objective of the project. The evaluation has been completed in compliance with Public Contract Code 20133(c)(1) and Government Code 4217.10 - 4217.18.

This project is anticipated to start on May 5, 2015 with an anticipated completion date of September 30, 2015. The total cost of the contract is \$418,923.

This project is funded by Scheduled Maintenance.

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Board of the Rancho Santiago Community College District ("District") has undertaken a Request for Proposal (RFP) #1415-94 released on March 6, 2015 with a response deadline of March 31, 2015;

**WHEREAS**, the selection committee was thorough in their review of all respondents that participated in the RFP;

**WHEREAS**, the approved companies are able to provide and construct energy efficient improvements to the district under the rules of California Government Code Sections 4217.10 through 4217.18;

**WHEREAS**, Government Code sections 4217.10 through 4217.18 authorize the District's Board of Trustees, without advertising for bids, to enter into one or more energy service contracts with any person or entity, pursuant to which that person or entity will provide electrical or thermal energy or conservation services to the District, which may comprise or include an energy conservation facility, if the anticipated cost to the District for thermal or electrical energy or conservation services provided under the contract(s) is less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of those energy service contracts;

**WHEREAS**, District staff reviewed the qualifications and proposal presented by CLIMATEC INC. to conduct and provide Energy Management Systems Upgrade as outlined per Request for Proposals #1415-94, and has found CLIMATEC INC. qualifications to be bona fide and adequate to provide such services;

**WHEREAS**, District staff reviewed the qualifications presented by NEWCOMB ANDERSON McCORMICK to conduct and provide assessment of college district energy usage, energy needs and opportunities to reduce energy expenses, and found NEWCOMB ANDERSON McCORMICK's qualifications to be bona fide and adequate to perform such services;

**WHEREAS**, District staff reviewed the qualifications presented by FACILITIES PLANNING AND PROGRAM SERVICES, INC.'S, to conduct and provide analysis of energy conservation project costs, and found FACILITIES PLANNING AND PROGRAM SERVICES, INC.'S, qualifications to be bona fide and adequate to perform such services;

**WHEREAS**, NEWCOMB ANDERSON McCORMICK and SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON ("Edison") assessed the feasibility of realizing actual energy and fiscal savings by upgrade to the Energy Management System to reduce the District's energy consumption and expense, and FACILITIES PLANNING AND PROGRAM SERVICES INC. assisted in comparing those anticipated savings against anticipated costs of the upgrades to the existing Energy Management System ("Analysis" see attached Exhibit A) upon which the Board and District administration and staff have relied;

**WHEREAS**, CLIMATEC INC. has offered to enter into a contract with the District for the implementation of upgrading the Energy Management System at Santiago Canyon College ("Contract") as energy conservation services;

**WHEREAS**, the Analysis demonstrates that the cost of the Contract to the District for the conservation services provided thereunder is less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the Contract ("Savings");

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**SUMMARY**

Santiago Canyon College, which first opened its doors in 1985, is a typical community college of the Rancho Santiago Community College District. The campus, which is located at 8045 East Chapman Avenue in the City of Orange, is situated within California climate zone 8. The original buildings of the campus were constructed in 1980 and throughout the years additional buildings have been constructed. Currently, most of the HVAC systems and some lighting at the campus are controlled by the American Auto-Matrix Energy Management System (EMS). Santiago Canyon College is looking to upgrade the EMS in order to achieve more comprehensive control of the HVAC systems and lighting of the campus. Newcomb Anderson McCormick (NAM) has been tasked to identify possible energy efficiency measures associated with an EMS Upgrade for the campus.

The energy efficiency measures that were analyzed are:

- Temperature Setbacks Based on Occupancy
- Static Pressure Reset
- Chilled Water (CHW) Supply Temperature Reset Base on Load
- Installation of VFD(s) on Chilled and Hot Water Pumps

In total, 65,477 kWh and 56 therms are estimated to be saved by implementing the above four measures at the campus. In addition, the potential utility incentive amount is approximately \$15,713 and the annual bill savings is estimated to be \$9,865 per year for the above energy efficiency measures.

It is important to note that the above measures are only a few of the many possible measures that can be implemented with a new comprehensive energy management system. This EMS upgrade is the backbone and platform for future energy efficiency projects that would not be possible with an outdated system with limited capabilities. This technical memorandum summarizes the existing conditions of the campus, energy modeling analysis, and results.

**EXISTING CONDITIONS**

*Energy Management System:*

The current EMS, by American Auto-Matrix, controlling the equipment in Buildings A, B, C, D, E, L and M was installed in 2002. The system is limited in its capabilities and is solely utilized to control the operating schedule of the equipment. The limitations of the American Auto-Matrix EMS include; archaic software architecture, an outdated user interface, complex controls programming and limited scheduling capabilities. During the pre-inspection, the logic and sequence of operations of the equipment controlled by the EMS could not be viewed. Therefore, it could not be determined whether any controls or resets have been implemented. In addition, the schedules and setpoints currently programmed into the EMS vary and are not standardized or optimized.

*HVAC Systems:*

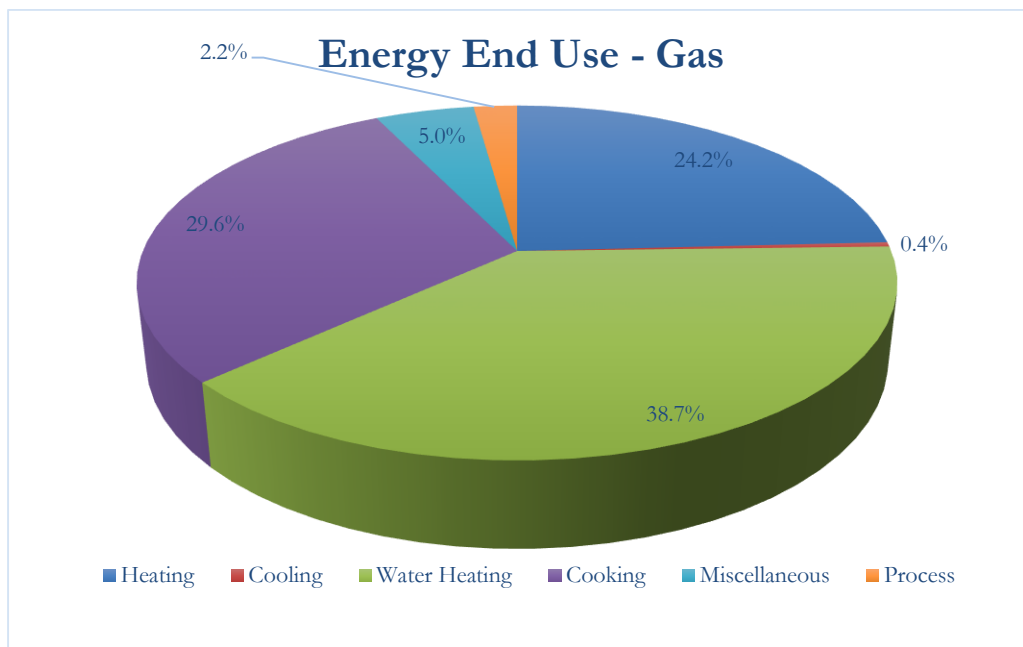
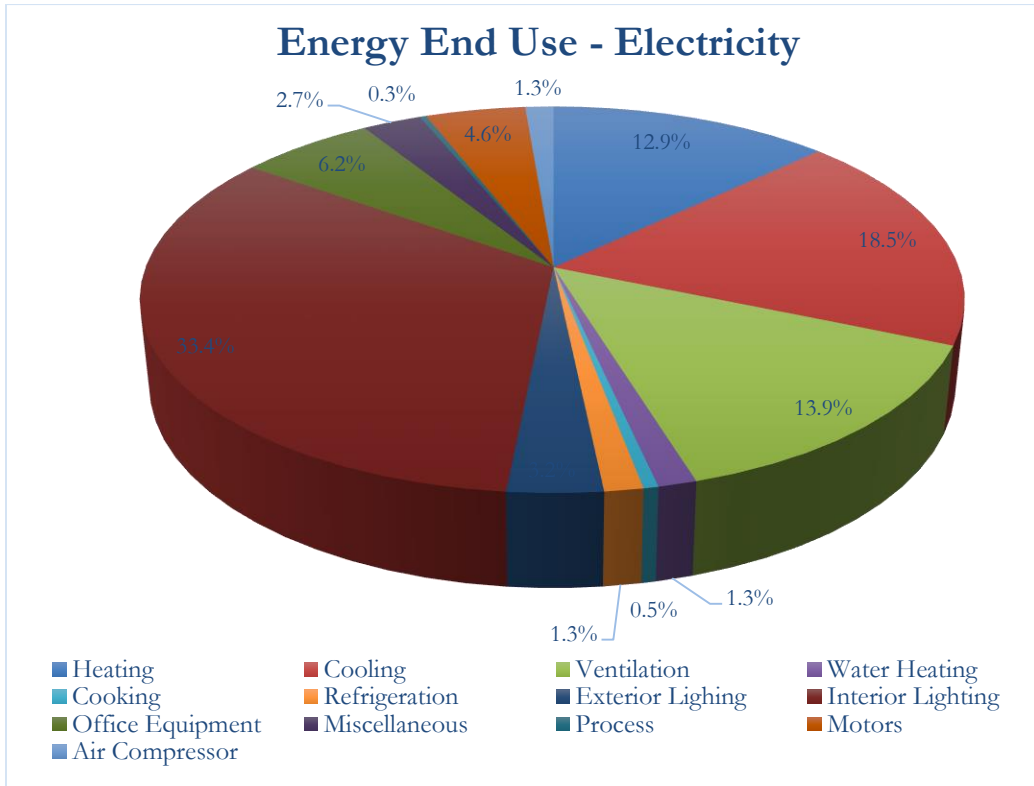
Each building at Santiago Canyon College is served by independent systems of varied vintage, type and size. While some equipment are newer, others were passed their Effective Useful Life (EUL). However, the scope of this technical analysis does not include equipment replacement. Refer to Table 1 for equipment descriptions and details for each building.

**ENERGY USE ANALYSIS**

The energy breakdown was estimated using CEUS data for college buildings for California climate zone 8. The California Commercial End-Use Survey (CEUS) is a comprehensive study of commercial building sector end-use energy use. The data from CEUS can be used to approximate the Santiago Canyon College buildings' end-use (see figure below). The CEUS data was used to keep the models in line with actual energy end use of a college within California climate zone 8.

### *Assumptions:*

Assumptions were made in order to best and conservatively model the buildings and HVAC systems. The models assumed:

- Due to the limited capabilities of the current EMS system, the controls/resets implemented for the HVAC systems could not be evaluated. However, to be conservative, it was assumed that Supply Air Temperature Reset was currently implemented based on Outside Air Temperature for Buildings A, B, E, and L. This control is commonplace and an industry standard.
- The HVAC systems' operating schedule was based on the schedule observed during on the EMS. The buildings' operating schedules were assumed to be equivalent to the HVAC systems'.
- When specifications for HVAC equipment could not be found, the default eQuest specifications were used.
- The efficiency of the air-cooled chiller serving Building D, which was originally manufactured in 1990, is assumed to be 1.35kW/ton. This efficiency is based on typical efficiencies of HVAC equipment manufactured in 1990, however, this assumption does not factor in degradation of the equipment. The efficiency was updated in order to calibrate the energy usage of the building.
- Based on DEER acceptable occupancy levels at a community college building, it was assumed that a particular space/zone is unoccupied 20% of the time.

### *Calibration:*

Calibration of the buildings' electric energy usage was performed in order to develop a more accurate and realistic model of each building. Calibration was not performed for gas usage because it could not be determined which meters served each building. The calibration strategy is as follows:

- The annual energy usage (electricity) was analyzed and determined using meter data from Southern California Edison (SCE). Buildings D and E each had its own meter. However, Buildings A, B and C shared a meter. For buildings that shared a meter, the building energy usage was estimated based on square-footage. (Building L and M energy usage could not be analyzed or determined. Therefore, buildings L and M were calibrated based on similarly sized buildings at the campus.)
- The models' energy usage baselines were targeted to be within 10-20% of actual energy usage. To be conservative, the models' baseline energy usage were kept below actual energy usage. This allows for the savings to be conservative and not overestimated.

### *Energy Efficiency Measures:*

The energy efficiency measures implemented in the models are described below:

- Temperature Setbacks Based on Occupancy
  - In order to achieve energy savings, when zones of a building are unoccupied the heating and cooling setpoints should be reset. This measure requires occupancy sensors to be installed in each zone. Based on DEER, community college's spaces are unoccupied 20% of operating hours. The temperature setpoints for cooling and heating for unoccupied zones are reset to 85°F and 55°F, respectively.
- Static Pressure Reset
  - This measure requires the installation of a static pressure sensors in each Variable Air Volume (VAV) boxes. Static Pressure Reset allows the air handling unit (AHU) to vary its flow to match the current building load – thus, saving energy when building loads are low. This measure requires that the AHUs to have variable speed motors for their fans.
- Chilled Water (CHW) Supply Temperature Reset Base on Load
  - This measure will allow the chiller to reset the CHW temperature based on the building load. Currently, the CHW supply temperature is constant and set at 40°F. This new control sequence will allow the CHW supply to vary between 40°F-50°F to meet building load.
- Installation of VFD(s) on Chilled and Hot Water Pumps
  - a. The chilled water and hot water pumps for building D currently have constant speed motors. Installing VFD(s) on the pumps will allow the system to be more efficient and reset to meet current building load. Based on the differential pressure set point, the BAS will signal the VFD to vary the pump speed to meet the differential pressure set point.

*Energy Savings:*

By implementing the four measures described herein, a total of 65,477 kWh and 56 therms are estimated to be saved. The table, below, breaks down the results per building. It is important to note that these savings estimates are conservatively low because the model was unable to be calibrated to actual energy usage data due to lack of full knowledge of the building system operations. For example; lights being left on, HVAC system inefficiencies and equipment degradation. However, since the estimated energy savings are conservatively low the actual energy savings will, at a minimum, meet the energy savings established by this analysis.

\*Building M's energy savings were estimated by extrapolating the baseline, proposed and energy savings of Building C. Building C and M are similar in size and have similar HVAC equipment.

*Additional Energy Efficiency Measures:*

Upgrading the EMS will allow for additional controls to be implemented such as, but not limited to:

- AHU DDC controller w/optimum start
- Cooling lockout based on outside air temperature (OSA)
- Exhaust fan control based on building occupancy
- Reduction of operating hours w/ override capabilities
- 100% economizer damper control
- Comprehensive lighting controls (occupancy based, after hour override, dimming)

It is important to note that the above measures are only a few of the many possible measures that can be implemented with a new comprehensive energy management system. This EMS upgrade is the backbone and platform for future energy efficiency projects that would not be possible with an outdated system with limited capabilities.

The District received two (2) bids for the project. Montgomery Hardware Co. (Rancho Cucamonga) submitted the lowest responsive bid for the amount of \$56,570. District staff has conducted a due diligence review to ensure compliance with license requirements. After review of the project bids received, it was recommended moving forward with award of the work described within Bid #1261 to Montgomery Hardware Co. The Vice Chancellor of Business Operations/Fiscal Services authorized the award of the contract, under the authority of CUPCCAA, to Montgomery Hardware Co.

**ANALYSIS**

The City of Santa Ana Police Department, Chief of Police Carols Rojas has sent a letter (attached), indicating their continued need for the portable classrooms. These two units will aid the city in providing ongoing training necessary for first responders in preparation for emergencies.

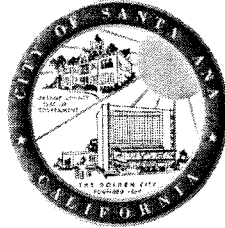
Education Code 81452 does allow the District to donate items including portables having no monetary value.

**RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT  
CLASSIFIED ADMINISTRATOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT**

1. **Parties.** The Rancho Santiago Community College District (“District”), on the one hand, and **Denise Donn** (“Administrator”), on the other hand, hereby enter into this Classified Administrator Employment Agreement (“Agreement”) pursuant to sub-section “a” of Section 72411 of the *Education Code*. District and Administrator are referred to herein individually as “Party” and collectively as “Parties.”

2. **Position.** District hereby employs Administrator in the position of **Interim Assistant Dean, Financial Aid, Scholarships and Veterans for Santiago Canyon College** (“Position”). Administrator is a “classified employee” as defined in sub-section “b” of Section 87001.5 of the *Education Code*, is a “classified administrator” as defined in sub-section “c” of Section 87002 of the *Education Code*, and is a “management employee” as defined in sub-section “g” of Section 3540.1 of the *Government Code*.

3. **Term.** District agrees to employ Administrator, and Administrator agrees to serve in the Position, for the period commencing April 14, 2015 and ending September 30, 2015.

4. **General Terms and Conditions of Employment.** This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, the regulations of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, and the rules, regulations, policies, and procedures of the District. These laws, rules, regulations, policies, and procedures, which may be amended, augmented, or repealed from time-to-time, are incorporated into this Agreement.

5. **Duties and Responsibilities.** Administrator agrees to perform all of the duties, and accepts all of the responsibilities, as specified in the job description for the Position, and all duties and responsibilities which may be delegated or assigned to Administrator by the Board of Trustees, the Chancellor, or any supervising administrators. Administrator is expected to devote full efforts and energies to the Position. At any time during the term of this Agreement, the Board of Trustees may adopt or amend the job description for the Position. Administrator may undertake outside professional activities, including consulting, speaking, and writing, either with or without compensation, provided that such activities do not impair the effectiveness of Administrator or interfere with Administrator’s duties. In those cases in which Administrator engages in outside professional activities which generate compensation for services provided, Administrator shall utilize vacation days.

6. **Transfer, Reassignment, or Title Change.** The Chancellor, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, may transfer or reassign Administrator to any position within the District for which Administrator is qualified, and may change the title of the Position, during the term of this Agreement, but there shall be no loss of compensation by Administrator due to such discretionary transfer, reassignment, or title change.

7. **Salary.** District shall pay an annual salary to Administrator in the amount of **\$105,835.11** per academic year (July 1 through June 30), pro-rated if less than a full academic

year, paid on a monthly basis. District reserves the right to increase the salary of Administrator during the term of this Agreement, but any such increase shall not be construed as an indication that this Agreement will be renewed or extended. Administrator agrees that District also reserves the right to decrease the salary of Administrator during the term of this Agreement as long as such decrease, on a percentage basis, is no more than what is implemented on a general basis for regular, full-time faculty of the District.

8. **Work Year.** Administrator is a full-time employee of the District with a work year of 12 months per year. Administrator is entitled to be absent during District-designated holidays.

9. **Health and Welfare Benefits.** District shall provide Administrator with the same health and welfare benefits as currently approved or as subsequently modified by the Board of Trustees for all District administrators.

10. **Vacation.** Administrator shall accrue two and one-quarter vacation days for each month of service.

11. **Leaves.** Administrator shall be entitled to leaves of absence as provided by law or Board Policy, as may be amended from time-to-time.

12. **Teaching Assignments.** Subject to Board approval, and presuming that Administrator meets minimum qualifications, Administrator may serve as an instructor in no more than one class per semester for additional compensation, provided that such teaching does not impair Administrator's service in the Position.

13. **Professional Meetings and Activities.** Prior approval by the Chancellor shall be obtained for Administrator to attend any meeting or activity related to Administrator's employment in the Position. The reasonable and necessary expenses of attendance by Administrator at such a meeting or activity shall be paid by District only if approved by the Chancellor and the Board of Trustees.

14. **Retreat Rights.** Administrator has no retreat rights to any faculty or classified position, except as provided by law.

15. **Dismissal or Imposition of Penalties During the Term of this Agreement.** Pursuant to Section 72411.5 of the *Education Code*, then the grounds for dismissal or for imposition of penalties on Administrator during the term of this Agreement shall be dishonesty, insubordination, incompetence, unsatisfactory performance, unprofessional conduct, inability to perform, persistent or serious violation of law or of Board Policy or procedures, or any material and substantial breach of this Agreement. Administrator shall be entitled to due process protections as required by law.

16. **Resignation.** Administrator may resign from District employment at any time during the term of this Agreement upon 90 days prior written notice to the Board of Trustees, or upon a shorter period of time as may be approved by the Board of Trustees.

17. **Medical Examination.** Upon request of the Board of Trustees or the Chancellor, Administrator agrees to undergo a comprehensive physical and/or psychiatric examination to

determine if Administrator is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Position. The costs of any such examination shall be paid for by District. A confidential written report regarding any such examination shall be filed with the Board of Trustees or the Chancellor indicating whether Administrator is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Position.

18. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is ruled to be contrary to law, all other provisions of this Agreement shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

19. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties. There are no terms, conditions, or oral understandings not contained in this Agreement.

20. **Amendment.** This Agreement may be modified or superseded only by a written amendment executed by both Parties.

21. **Mandatory Mediation and Arbitration.** Except as otherwise prohibited by law, the Parties agree that any dispute, claim, or controversy arising out of the Parties' employment relationship, including, but not limited to, alleged violations of federal, state, or local statutes, including those prohibiting harassment and discrimination, and any other claims, including alleged violations of any provisions of the *Education Code*, which cannot be resolved through informal and confidential discussions, shall be submitted to mediation, and if mediation if unsuccessful, to binding arbitration before a neutral Arbitrator. The mediator and any necessary Arbitrator shall be selected through Judicial Arbitration & Mediation Services/Endispute (JAMS). Attachment "A" to this Agreement sets forth the procedures to be utilized and is hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement as if fully set forth within. The Parties agree that they have carefully read Attachment "A," knowingly agree to all of its contents, and knowingly agree to the covenant to mediate and arbitrate all employment disputes contained in Attachment "A".

22. **Ratification.** The Parties agree that this Agreement is not binding or enforceable unless and until it is duly ratified by the Board of Trustees.

1. **Parties.** The Rancho Santiago Community College District (“District”), on the one hand, and **Kari Irwin** (“Administrator”), on the other hand, hereby enter into this Educational Administrator Employment Agreement (“Agreement”) pursuant to sub-section “a” of Section 72411 of the *Education Code*. District and Administrator are referred to herein individually as “Party” and collectively as “Parties.”
2. **Position.** District hereby employs Administrator in the position of **Associate Dean, Business and Career Technical Education for Santiago Canyon College** (“Position”). Administrator is an “academic employee” as defined in sub-section “a” of Section 87001 of the *Education Code*, is an “educational administrator” as defined in sub-section “b” of Section 87002 of the *Education Code*, and is a “management employee” as defined in sub-section “g” of Section 3540.1 of the *Government Code*.
3. **Term.** District agrees to employ Administrator, and Administrator agrees to serve in the Position, for the period commencing **April 7, 2015** and ending **June 30, 2016**. If, prior to June 30 of any other year other than the last year of this Agreement the District does not send or deliver a written notice to Administrator that this Agreement shall not be extended for an additional year, then this Agreement automatically shall be extended for one more year. Any notice of non-reemployment in the position must be given by the District at least six (6) months in advance of the date of termination of this Agreement. If notice of non-reemployment is not given by the District at least six (6) months in advance of the date of termination of this Agreement, then the Agreement shall be extended for one (1) additional year pursuant to Education Code Section 72411(c).
4. **General Terms and Conditions of Employment.** This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, the regulations of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, and the rules, regulations, policies, and procedures of the District. These laws, rules, regulations, policies, and procedures, which may be amended, augmented, or repealed from time-to-time, are incorporated into this Agreement.

The costs of any such examination shall be paid for by District. A confidential written report regarding any such examination shall be filed with the

Board of Trustees or the Chancellor indicating whether Administrator is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Position.

22. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is ruled to be contrary to law, all other provisions of this Agreement shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

23. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties. There are no terms, conditions, or oral understandings not contained in this Agreement.

24. **Amendment.** This Agreement may be modified or superseded only by a written amendment executed by both Parties.

25. **Mandatory Mediation and Arbitration.** Except as otherwise prohibited by law, the Parties agree that any dispute, claim, or controversy arising out of the Parties' employment relationship, including, but not limited to, alleged violations of federal, state, or local statutes, including those prohibiting harassment and discrimination, and any other claims, including alleged violations of any provisions of the *Education Code*, which cannot be resolved through informal and confidential discussions, shall be submitted to mediation, and if mediation if unsuccessful, to binding arbitration before a neutral Arbitrator. The mediator and any necessary Arbitrator shall be selected through Judicial Arbitration & Mediation Services/Endispute (JAMS). Attachment "A" to this Agreement sets forth the procedures to be utilized and is hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement as if fully set forth within. The Parties agree that they have carefully read Attachment "A," knowingly agree to all of its contents, and knowingly agree to the covenant to mediate and arbitrate all employment disputes contained in Attachment "A".

26. **Ratification.** The Parties agree that this Agreement is not binding or enforceable unless and until it is duly ratified by the Board of Trustees.

EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT**

1. **Parties.** The Rancho Santiago Community College District (“District”), on the one hand, and **Syed Rizvi** (“Administrator”), on the other hand, hereby enter into this Educational Administrator Employment Agreement (“Agreement”) pursuant to sub-section “a” of Section 72411 of the *Education Code*. District and Administrator are referred to herein individually as “Party” and collectively as “Parties.”

2. **Position.** District hereby employs Administrator in the position of **Dean, Enrollment and Support Services for Santiago Canyon College** (“Position”). Administrator is an “academic employee” as defined in sub-section “a” of Section 87001 of the *Education Code*, is an “educational administrator” as defined in sub-section “b” of Section 87002 of the *Education Code*, and is a “management employee” as defined in sub-section “g” of Section 3540.1 of the *Government Code*.

3. **Term.** District agrees to employ Administrator, and Administrator agrees to serve in the Position, for the period commencing **March 19, 2015** and ending **June 30, 2016**. If, prior to June 30 of any other year other than the last year of this Agreement the District does not send or deliver a written notice to Administrator that this Agreement shall not be extended for an additional year, then this Agreement automatically shall be extended for one more year. Any notice of non-reemployment in the position must be given by the District at least six (6) months in advance of the date of termination of this Agreement. If notice of non-reemployment is not given by the District at least six (6) months in advance of the date of termination of this Agreement, then the Agreement shall be extended for one (1) additional year pursuant to Education Code Section 72411(c).

4. **General Terms and Conditions of Employment.** This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, the regulations of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, and the rules, regulations, policies, and procedures of the District. These laws, rules, regulations, policies, and procedures, which may be amended, augmented, or repealed from time-to-time, are incorporated into this Agreement.

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6. **Transfer, Reassignment, or Title Change.** The Chancellor, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, may transfer or reassign Administrator to any position within the District for which Administrator is qualified, and may change the title of the Position, during the term of this Agreement, but there shall be no loss of compensation by Administrator due to such discretionary transfer, reassignment, or title change.

7. **Salary.** District shall pay an annual salary to Administrator in the amount of **\$144,525.90** per academic year (July 1 through June 30), pro-rated if less than a full academic year, paid on a monthly basis. District reserves the right to increase the salary of Administrator during the term of this Agreement, but any such increase shall not be construed as an indication that this Agreement will be renewed or extended. Administrator agrees that District also reserves the right to decrease the salary of Administrator during the term of this Agreement as long as such decrease, on a percentage basis, is no more than what is implemented on a general basis for regular, full-time faculty of the District. Administrator is an exempt employee and is not eligible for overtime pay or compensatory time off.

8. **Work Year.** Administrator is a full-time employee of the District with a work year of 12 months per year. Administrator is entitled to be absent during District-designated holidays.

9. **Health and Welfare Benefits.** District shall provide Administrator with the same health and welfare benefits as currently approved or as subsequently modified by the Board of Trustees for all District administrators.

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11. **Leaves.** Administrator shall be entitled to leaves of absence as provided by law or Board Policy, as may be amended from time-to-time.

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15. **Retreat Rights.** If Administrator's first date of paid service was prior to July 1, 1990, Administrator's rights to faculty tenure are governed by the laws of the State of California

in effect as of June 30, 1990. The retreat rights for Administrator, if hired on or after July 1, 1990, and if Administrator does not have faculty tenure in the District, shall be in accordance with Section 87458 of the *Education Code*. Administrator has the responsibility to present the necessary transcripts and materials to District pursuant to Board policy and procedures in order to maintain any current faculty service area or acquire faculty service areas.

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19. **Resignation.** Administrator may resign from District employment at any time during the term of this Agreement upon 90 days prior written notice to the Board of Trustees, or upon a shorter period of time as may be approved by the Board of Trustees.

20. **Buy-Out of Agreement.** Pursuant to Section 53260 of the *Government Code*, except if District terminates this Agreement pursuant to Sections 17 or 18 of this Agreement, the maximum cash settlement that Administrator may receive shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of Administrator multiplied by the number of months left on the unexpired term of this Agreement. However, if the unexpired term of this Agreement is greater than 18 months, the maximum cash settlement shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of Administrator multiplied by 18. Any cash settlement shall not include any other non-cash items except health benefits which may be continued for the same duration of time as covered in the settlement or until Administrator finds other employment, whichever comes first. If the unexpired term is greater than 18 months, then the maximum time for continued health benefits paid for by District shall be 18 months.
