This Agreement, made and entered into this 1st day of July, 2015, by and between:

RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as RSCCD, and the JTS SERVICES, hereinafter referred to as JTS:

#### WITNESSETH:

It is the intent of RSCCD and JTS to enter into an agreement whereby RSCCD will reimburse JTS for all instructional materials and curriculum development used by and for RSCCD indentured cosmetology apprentices.

#### ARTICLE I - RECITALS

Whereas, RSCCD provides vocational education and supplemental instruction for the cosmetology apprentice in accordance with the provisions of the Labor Code Section 3070 et seq.

Whereas, JTS has established a "unilateral apprenticeship training committee" and "local apprenticeship program sponsor" within the meaning of California Education Code Section 8150 et seq and California Labor Code 3074, and

Whereas, RSCCD and JTS desire to enter into an agreement concerning the calculation and payment of costs pursuant to Labor Code Section 3074 and Education Code 8152.

Whereas, we jointly pledge: We affirm that the recruitment, selection, employment, and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship shall be without discrimination because of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex. We will take affirmative action to provide equal opportunity in apprenticeship and will operate the apprenticeship as required by the California Plan for Equal Opportunity in Apprenticeship and by the California Administrative Code, Title 8, Chapter 2.

We affirm that the recruitment, selection, employment and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship shall be without discrimination because of mental or physical disability. The sponsor will take affirmative action to provide equal opportunity in apprenticeship for persons with disabilities and will operate the apprenticeship program consistent with the requirements

of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12100 et seq).

Now, therefore, it is mutually agreed by and between said parties hereto as follows:

#### ARTICLE II - RESPONSIBILITIES OF RSCCD

- 1. RSCCD will conduct classes and related instruction for cosmetology apprentices duly registered with RSCCD.
- 2. RSCCD will follow course of study approved by the District Board of Trustees based on minimum requirements provided for in the RSCCD college curriculum and JTS's Training Standards.
- 3. RSCCD shall arrange for utilizing the instructional staff employed by the JTS under requirements detailed in Section 53413 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code. RSCCD has the primary right to control and direct the instructional activities of the instructional staff furnished JTS
- 4. RSCCD will organize and provide class schedules, register students, maintain records of student attendance and achievements. These records shall be available for review at all times.

#### ARTICLE III - RESPONSIBILITIES OF JTS

#### A. <u>Instruction and Curriculum</u>

- 1. JTS shall provide instructor manuals, instructional supplies, and other teaching aids necessary to instruct classes.
- 2. JTS shall monitor the students, maintain records of work experience and be responsible for apprentice evaluation and counseling regarding on-site work experience. These records shall be available to RSCCD and State of California.
- 3. JTS shall provide clerical support to maintain training records.
- 4. JTS instructors will meet the minimum qualifications for instructors as stated in Section 53413 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code and will be certified as adjunct faculty for RSCCD. RSCCD will require the instructors to complete any training mandated by the State of California for instructors to maintain the minimum qualifications to teach college credit apprenticeship courses.

- 5. JTS shall provide funds for and administer one (1) instructor workshop annually.
- 6. JTS shall employ instructional aides and/or tool room attendants. Such personnel will be responsible for assisting instructors and placing all tools, equipment and materials in the training areas when needed by the instructors.

#### B. Facilities, Equipment and Supplies

- 1. JTS shall provide training facilities. Said facilities are hereby designated as offcampus facilities pursuant to Labor Code Section 3074, JTS will be responsible for the maintenance of these facilities.
- 2. JTS shall provide, install and maintain in a safe condition power equipment and hand tools necessary to conduct the instruction program.
- 3. JTS shall provide instructional supplies and materials.

#### **ARTICLE IV - GENERAL PROVISIONS**

- 1. This Agreement shall commence with the beginning of the fiscal year (July 1, 2015) and will continue until the end of the fiscal year (June 30, 2016), unless earlier terminated by either party in the manner set forth herein.
- 2. All persons employed by JTS and performing services for their training committee shall be solely employees of JTS. JTS will be responsible for the salaries and other benefits including Worker's Compensation of all such personnel.
- 3. RSCCD shall pay JTS an amount equal to seventy-five percent (75%), amount specified for each clock hour of teaching time per apprentice. Payment shall be made to the JTS Services, 1905 E. 17<sup>th</sup> St., #316, Santa Ana, CA, 92705, within sixty (60) days of receipt of final positive attendance hours and grades each semester.
- 4. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal delivery, or sent by U.S. certified mail, postage pre-paid with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. All such notices personally delivered shall be effective when received. All notices sent by certified mail shall be effective forty-eight hours after deposited in the mail.

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.
- 6. Each party shall maintain and secure comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.
- 7. This Agreement and the rights and duties thereunder shall not be assigned in whole or in part without the written consent of both said parties.

- 8 When the following condition exists, this Agreement may be cancelled by either said party hereto upon giving of thirty (30) days advance written notice. Such notice shall be personally served or given by United States mail.
  - a. Emergency conditions resulting from acts of God.
  - b. Non-performance of the terms of this Agreement.
- 9. RSCCD agrees to provide JTS with records indicating attendance, income and expenditure data.

  - 5. OETTJATC shall provide clerical support to maintain training records.
  - 6. OETTJATC instructors will meet the minimum qualifications for instructors as stated in Section 53413 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code and will be certified as adjunct faculty for RSCCD. RSCCD will require the instructors to complete any training mandated by the State of California for instructors to

maintain the minimum qualifications to teach college credit apprenticeship courses.

- 7. OETTJATC shall provide funds for and administer one (1) instructor workshop annually.

Rancho Santiago Community College District-Santiago Canyon College (RSCCD-SCC) receives \$5.06 per student hour of positive attendance. The student attendance hours are reported separately from the traditional FTES calculations. The contractual agreement attached outlines the allocation of funds from the California Budget Act and Section 8150 of the California Education Code with respect to the Related and Supplement Instruction (RSI) formula.

### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the Master Cost Agreement with the Southwest Carpenters Training Fund (SCTF) and Southern California Carpentry Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee (JATC) for 2015-2016 as presented.

Fiscal Impact: Approximately \$125,100 to RSCCD-SCC. Board Date: May 26, 2015 The RSCCD-SCC shall pay Southwest Carpenters Training Fund and Southern California Carpentry JATC an amount equal to eighty-five (85%) for each clock hour of teaching time per apprentice. The amount shall not exceed \$715,000.

# MASTER COST AGREEMENT

#### BETWEEN

# RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

#### AND

### SOUTHWEST CARPENTERS TRAINING FUND

AND

# SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CARPENTRY JOINT APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COMMITTEE

This Agreement, made and entered into this 1st day of July, 2015, by and between:

RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as RSCCD and SOUTHWEST CARPENTERS TRAINING FUND hereinafter referred to as FUND and SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CARPENTRY JOINT APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COMMITTEE hereinafter referred to as SCCJATC:

#### WITNESSETH:

It is the intent of RSCCD and FUND/SCCJATC to enter into an agreement whereby RSCCD will reimburse the FUND/SCCJATC for instructional materials and curriculum development used by and for RSCCD indentured carpenter apprentices.

#### **ARTICLE I - RECITALS**

Whereas, RSCCD provides vocational education and supplemental instruction for the apprentice carpenter in accordance with the provisions of the Labor Code Section 3070 et seq.

Whereas, FUND/SCCJATC is a "joint apprenticeship training council" and "local apprenticeship program sponsor" within the meaning of California Education Code Section 8150 et seq and California Labor Code Section 3074, and

Whereas, RSCCD and FUND/SCCJATC desire to enter into an agreement concerning the calculation and payment of costs pursuant to Labor Code Section 3074 and Education Code 8152.

Whereas, we jointly pledge: We affirm that the recruitment, selection, employment, and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship shall be without discrimination because of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex. We will take affirmative action to provide equal

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opportunity in apprenticeship and will operate the apprenticeship as required by the California Plan for Equal Opportunity in Apprenticeship and by the California Administrative Code, Title 8, Chapter 2.

We affirm that the recruitment, selection, employment and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship shall be without discrimination because of mental or physical disability. The sponsor will take affirmative action to provide equal opportunity in apprenticeship for persons with disabilities and will operate the apprenticeship program consistent with the requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12100 et seq).

Now, therefore, it is mutually agreed by and between said parties hereto as follows:

# **ARTICLE II - RESPONSIBILITIES OF RSCCD**

- 1. RSCCD will conduct classes and related instruction for apprentice and journeyman carpenters duly registered with RSCCD.
- 2. RSCCD will follow course of study approved by the District Board of Trustees based on minimum requirements provided for in the RSCCD college curriculum and SCCJATC'S Training Standards.
- 3. RSCCD shall arrange for utilizing the instructional staff employed by the FUND/SCCJATC under requirements detailed in Section 53413 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code. RSCCD has the primary right to control and direct the instructional activities of the instructional staff furnished by FUND/SCCJATC.
- 4. RSCCD will organize and provide class schedules, register students, maintain records of student attendance and achievements. These records shall be available for review at all times.

# **ARTICLE III - RESPONSIBILITIES OF FUND/SCCJATC**

- A. Instruction and Curriculum
  - 1. FUND/SCCJATC shall provide instructor manuals and other teaching aids necessary to instruct the classes.
  - 2. FUND/SCCJATC shall monitor the students, maintain records of work experience education and be responsible for apprentice evaluation and counseling regarding on-site work experience. These records shall be available to RSCCD and State of California.

- 3. FUND/SCCJATC shall provide clerical support to maintain training records.
- 4. FUND/SCCJATC instructors will meet the minimum qualifications for instruction as stated in Section 53413 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code and will be certified as adjunct instructors for RSCCD. RSCCD will require the instructors to complete any training mandated by the State of California for instructors to maintain the minimum qualifications to teach college-credit apprenticeship courses.
- 5. FUND/SCCJATC shall provide funds for and administer one (1) instructor workshop annually.

### B. Facilities, Equipment and Supplies

- 1. FUND/SCCJATC shall provide training facilities. Said facilities are hereby designated as off-campus facilities pursuant to Labor Code Section 3074, SCCJATC will be responsible for the maintenance of these facilities.
- 2. FUND/SCCJATC shall provide, install, and maintain in a safe condition power equipment and hand tools necessary to conduct the instruction program.
- 3. FUND/SCCJATC shall provide instructional supplies and materials.
- 4. RSCCD utilizes the following real property, 7111 Firestone Blvd. Ste 137, Buena Park, CA 90621 and 10015 Rose Hills Road # 200, Whittier, CA 90601, costs of which are included in this Master Cost Agreement.

### **ARTICLE IV - GENERAL PROVISIONS**

- A. This Agreement shall commence with the beginning of the fiscal year (July 1, 2015) and will continue until the end of the fiscal year (June 30, 2016), unless earlier terminated by either party in the manner set forth herein.
- B. All persons employed by FUND/SCCJATC and performing services for FUND/SCCJATC shall be solely employees of FUND/SCCJATC and not employees of RSCCD. FUND/SCCJATC shall be solely responsible for the salaries and other benefits including Worker's Compensation of all such personnel.
- C. RSCCD shall pay FUND/SCCJATC an amount equal to eighty-five percent (85%) of the amount specified for each clock hour of teaching time per apprentice. Payment shall be made to the Carpenters Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee Fund for Southern California, 533 S. Fremont Ave., Suite 401, Los Angeles, California 90071-1706, within sixty (60) days of the receipt of positive attendance hours. RSCCD assumes all

responsibility for the submission and accuracy of positive hours of attendance to the State of California.

- D. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal delivery, or sent by U.S. certified mail, postage pre-paid with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. All such notices personally delivered shall be effective when received. All notices sent by certified mail shall be effective forty-eight hours after deposited in the mail.

  - To FUND: Southwest Carpenters Training Fund 533 S. Fremont Ave., Suite 401 Los Angeles, CA 90071-1706
  - To SCCJATC: Southern California Carpentry Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee 533 S. Freemont Ave., Suite 401 Los Angeles, CA 90071-1706
- E. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.
- F. Each party shall maintain and secure comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full

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force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

- G. This Agreement and the rights and duties thereunder shall not be assigned in whole or in part without the written consent of both said parties.
- H. When the following condition exists, this Agreement may be cancelled by either said party hereto upon giving of thirty (30) days advance written notice. Such notice shall be personally served or given by United States mail.
  - 1. Emergency conditions resulting from acts of God.
  - 2. Non-performance of the terms of this Agreement.
- 1. RSCCD agrees to provide SCCJATC with records indicating attendance, income and expenditure data.
- J. The parties hereto have executed this Agreement on the dates specified immediately adjacent to their respective signatures.

#### BACKGROUND

Each year, the Board of Trustees approves Budget Assumptions that serve as the foundation used in the development of the district's annual budget.

#### ANALYSIS

At this stage of the 2016-17 budget preparation cycle, the district is basing its assumptions on the Governor's January Budget Proposal which includes a modest 0.47% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA). Although his proposal also includes 2% systemwide growth funding, the district assumptions do not include any funding for growth based on the colleges' current growth estimates. With an increase in nonresident students projected, there is an additional \$500,000 in tuition revenue anticipated. In addition, the apprenticeship allocation increased by over \$600,000, with corresponding expenditures also budgeted. The revenue assumptions net approximately \$1.9 million in additional ongoing funding along with \$1.9 million in additional one-time funding. The expense assumptions net approximately \$5.4 million in additional ongoing costs including step and column movement, a projected 5% increase in health and welfare benefits for the second half of the year, PERS and STRS rate increases, additional full-time faculty hiring, and increased utilities and Information Technology Services contract escalation costs. Based on these assumptions, the ongoing budget produces a structural deficit of \$3.55 million.

The Fiscal Resources Committee (FRC) unanimously recommended covering the 2016-17 deficit of \$3.55 million with one-time Budget Stabilization Funds (BSF). As this deficit is ongoing and will increase in the future if revenue is insufficient to cover increasing ongoing expenses, the Chancellor is recommending the attached assumptions for approval by the Board of Trustees with one exception. The Chancellor has communicated to FRC and District Council that \$2 million of the structural deficit is to be taken from BSF and tasked FRC to prepare a plan to implement necessary ongoing budget reductions for the difference of \$1.55 million.

When additional information becomes available, such as the May Revise, these assumptions will be updated for the Tentative Budget presented to the Board of Trustees for approval on June 13, 2016. Once a state budget is enacted by the Legislature by the end of June, any necessary changes to our state funding can be made in the district's proposed Adopted Budget for approval by the Board of Trustees on September 12, 2016.

- C. Education Protection Account (EPA) funding estimated at \$24,480,078 based on 2015/16 P1. These are not additional funds. The EPA is only a portion of general purpose funds that offsets what would otherwise be state aid in the apportionments. We intend to charge a portion of faculty salaries to this funding source in compliance with EPA requirements.
- D. Unrestricted lottery is projected at \$140 per FTES (\$4,200,032). Restricted lottery at \$41 per FTES (\$1,230,009). (2015/16 P1 of resident & nonresident factored FTES, 30,000.23 x 140 = \$4,200,032 unrestricted lottery; 30,000.23 x 41 = \$1,230,009.) With an slight increase in estimated FTES there is an increase in revenue.
- E. Estimated reimbursement for part-time faculty compensation is estimated at \$674,926 (2015/16 P1). Slight Increase.
- F. Categorical programs will continue to be budgeted separately; self-supporting, matching revenues and expenditures. COLA is being proposed on certain categorical programs. Without COLA, other categorical reductions would be required to remain in balance if settlements were reached with bargaining groups. The colleges will need to budget for any program match requirements using unrestricted funds.
- G. BOG fee waivers 2% administration funding estimated at 2015/16 advance apportionment of \$284,586. Unchanged.
- H. Mandates Block Grant estimated at a total budget of \$740,000. Unchanged. In addition, with a one-time \$76.3 million allocation statewide for past Mandated Cost reimbursement, we expect approximately \$1.9 million in one time funds. These funds can be used for any one-time purposes and will require additional discussion before allocation.

- I. Non-Resident Tuition budgeted at \$2,500,000. Increase of \$500,000.
- J. Interest earnings estimated at \$180,000. Unchanged.
- K. Other miscellaneous income (includes fines, fees, rents, etc.) is estimated at approximately \$350,000. Unchanged.
- L. Apprenticeship revenue estimated at \$2,538,900 (2015/16 P1). Increase of approximately \$628,000. (Corresponding expenses related to this increase must be budgeted for additional apprenticeship course offerings)
- M Scheduled Maintenance/Instructional Equipment allocation estimated at \$7 million (no match required).
- N. Energy Efficiency/Prop 39 revenue estimated at \$1 million. Slight increase from 2015/16.

- III. Appropriations and Expenditures
  - A. As the District's budget model is a revenue allocation model, revenues flow through the model to the colleges as earned. The colleges have the responsibility, within their earned revenue, to budget for ALL necessary expenditures including but not limited to all full time and part time employees, utilities, instructional services agreements, multi-year maintenance and other contracts, supplies, equipment and other operating costs.
  - B. The Cost of Living Allowance (COLA) estimated at 0.47%, \$680,000.
  - C. Step and column movement is budgeted at an additional cost of approximately \$1.1 million including benefits. (FARSCCD approximate cost \$415,000, CSEA approximate cost \$340,000, Management/Other approximate cost \$345,000)
  - D. Health and Welfare benefit premium cost increase is estimated at 5% (for half the year) for an additional cost of approximately \$455,000 for active employees and an additional cost of \$155,000 for retirees, for a combined increase of \$610,000.
     State Unemployment Insurance local experience charges are estimated at \$250,000 (2015/16 budgeted amount). Unchanged.
     CalPERS employer contribution rate will increase in 2016/17 from 11.847% to 13.05% for an increase of \$427,162.
     (Note: The cost of each 1% increase in the PERS rate is approximately \$350,000.)

CalSTRS employer contribution rate will increase in 2016/17 from 10.73% to 12.58% for an increase of \$1,281,544. (Note: The cost of each 1% increase in the STRS rate is approximately \$700,000.)

E. The full-time faculty obligation (FON) for Fall 2016 is estimated at 364.99. The District is currently recruiting 48 faculty positions (11 of which do not count toward the FON) for an estimated total of 37 positions counting toward the obligation. The District expects to meet its obligation. Penalties for not meeting the obligation amount to approximately \$73,000 per FTE not filled.

The additional cost of new full-time faculty being hired for Fall 2016 is estimated at \$382,437. SAC is filling 10 vacancies and adding 11 new positions. SCC is filling nine vacancies and adding six new positions. (The cost of the 17 new positions, along with shifts from categorical funding, is budgeted at Class VI, Step 10 at approximately \$127,000 each, including benefits.)

- F. The current rate per Lecture Hour Equivalent (LHE) effective since 1/1/15 for hourly faculty is \$1,243.
- G. Retiree Health Benefit Fund (OPEB/GASB 45 Obligation) The District will continue to contribute an amount to fund the total actuarially determined Annual Required Contribution (ARC). The actual ARC for 2016/17 is expected to be over \$8 million. We should have the latest actuarial report and the new ARC for the Adopted Budget.
- H. Capital Outlay Fund In addition to the state allocation for Scheduled Maintenance/Instructional Equipment, the District will continue to budget \$1.5 million for capital outlay needs.
- I. Utilities cost increases of 5%, estimated at \$200,000.
- J. Information Technology licensing contract escalation cost of 7%, estimated at \$125,000.
- K. Property and Liability Insurance transfer estimated at \$1,940,000. Unchanged.
- L. Other additional DS/Institutional Cost expenses: Legal Expenses of \$250,000 (from one-time funds)
- M. Child Development Fund The District will continue to budget \$250,000 as an interfund transfer from the unrestricted general fund as a contingency plan. (\$140,000 was transferred in 2014/15 and expected in 2015/16)

#### BACKGROUND:

As part of Proposition 39 Year 3 projects, the District will undertake a LED Conversion project at Building I and Building Z at Santa Ana College. Project scope includes replacement of interior lighting with new LED lighting tubes and retrofit kits and exterior LED lighting conversion lights at parking lot numbers 12 and 13. After the lighting conversion is complete, the District anticipates yearly energy savings of 85,027 KWH which will generate a one-time estimated utility rebate of \$7,848.

#### ANALYSIS:

In accordance with the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act, Bid #1279 for Buildings I & Z LED Lighting Conversion at Santa Ana College was posted on January 22, 2016 and a Notice Calling for Bids was sent to fifty-nine (59) contractors from the District's qualified contractors list on January 22, 2016.

A mandatory job walk was conducted on February 1, 2016. Bids were opened on February 26, 2016 as noted on the attached bid result form. The District received seven (7) bids for the project. Coast Electric (Santa Ana) submitted the lowest responsive bid for the amount of \$72,075. District staff conducted a due diligence review to ensure compliance with license requirements. After review of the bids received, the District recommends approval of award of Bid #1279 to Coast Electric. The Vice Chancellor of Business Operations/Fiscal Services authorized the award of the contract, under the authority of CUPCCAA, to Coast Electric.

The anticipated construction start will be March 22, 2016 with an estimated construction duration of ninety days.

The project is funded by Proposition 39, Utility Rebates.

#### BACKGROUND

Protection of data and enterprise systems is a critical investment within ITS. A penetration test is an attempt to evaluate the security of an IT infrastructure by safely trying to exploit vulnerabilities. These vulnerabilities may exist in various areas such as operating systems, service and application flaws, improper configurations, or risky end-user behavior. Assessments are also useful in validating the efficacy of defensive mechanisms and will help set our upcoming security initiatives and plans.

#### ANALYSIS

ITS is due to perform a penetration test and has requested an information security assessment focused on identifying information security threats and vulnerabilities and applicable mitigation strategies. The Security Assessment will meet these requirements and help RSCCD identify security deficiencies that may exist within its enterprise network. We plan to have the initial testing performed, take remediation steps to tighten security, and subsequently retest.

The cost for this initial security assessment is \$23,625 and will be funded by the ITS operations budget.

# **Service Overview**

### **Security Assessment**

RSCCD has requested an information security assessment focused on identifying information security threats and vulnerabilities and applicable mitigation strategies. The Security Assessment will meet these requirements and help RSCCD identify security deficiencies that may exist within its enterprise network.

# **Service Activities and Approach**

## **Security Assessment**

#### **Comprehensive Perimeter Penetration Test**

Optiv's Comprehensive Penetration Test leverages an in-depth methodology that uses commercial and customized tools designed to ensure thorough analysis of the targets and attack surface. Optiv begins with a discovery phase, using proprietary methods and open source tools to establish a comprehensive view of RSCCD's network, systems, and applications. Multiple automated scans, paralleled with manual examination, are used to expose potential weaknesses that may exist within the network. Optiv will perform penetration testing on unauthenticated web applications (and using authenticated application roles if defined in the scoping assumptions), looking for weaknesses such as those defined in the OWASP Top 10 Application vulnerability categories that could lead to system compromise or sensitive information disclosure.

If Optiv can obtain a foothold into the network, the knowledge that foothold provides will be used to escalate privileges and compromise additional systems. Using this expanded access, Optiv will seek to locate and exfiltrate sensitive data.

This information is incorporated into Optiv's proprietary correlation and data normalization tool, which is used to ensure all potential areas for access or exploitation are evaluated. This allows Optiv to thoroughly analyze complex attack vectors or multi-faceted weaknesses while ensuring all systems are evaluated. Optiv will then perform validation through a targeted penetration test that focuses on high-risk findings. Exploitation of these findings often yields access to critical systems and sensitive information vital to RSCCD operations. Upon completion of testing, the consultants collect assessment findings in a customized report designed to provide detailed, actionable information while eliminating false positives. This information is presented to RSCCD in both technical and non-technical formats.

#### **Discovery Phase**

Optiv will gather information from a variety of sources to gain knowledge about RSCCD's network and other Internet locations where pertinent devices and hosts may reside. This phase focuses on identifying a comprehensive list of live hosts. Optiv uses a variety of tests and data sources to identify live systems that may otherwise be missed through more basic host identification tests (such as a ping sweep). Identifying more obscure hosts can provide additional areas of concern. These hosts may not be known to RSCCD, and may not be tested during routine tests, and may contain additional vulnerabilities due to their inadvertent exclusion from organization policies such as patch management and system hardening. Optiv will:



- Perform general foot printing to determine scope of the perimeter
- Interrogate DNS servers, public search engines, and other public sources for exposed hosts and IP addresses
- Examine trace route output for in-scope intermediary hosts
- Perform host identification scans, leveraging TCP, UDP, and ICMP protocols to locate live hosts.

The live hosts identified during the discovery phase will be used to establish the list of in-scope hosts for all additional phases of the engagement.

#### **Target Profiling Phase**

During the Target Profiling Phase, Optiv will perform a comprehensive analysis of the exposed attack surface of all in-scope hosts identified in the discovery phase and will establish detailed profiles, identifying software and configuration information that could be leveraged in an attack. This includes identifying:

- Device operating systems
- Exposed ports, running services, and specific software versions installed using comprehensive port and service scans
- Accessible files or configuration information
- Unencrypted network management protocols
- Supported encryption algorithms and authentication mechanisms for SSL and IPSec enabled protocols
- Locally exposed broadcast and multicast traffic, their underlying protocols, and notable configuration settings (Internal network only)
- Virtual host URLs that could expose additional content
- Exposed web applications and their underlying programming languages that may have known systemic weaknesses
- Accessible web management consoles (Tomcat, JBoss, GlassFish, WebLogic, etc.)
- Backend or directly exposed database software and versions
- Limited publicly exposed information that could be used for manual risk validation
- Configuration issues that may not directly expose a vulnerability within the context of the environment, but could be leveraged in multi-faceted attacks

These system profiles are then normalized and placed into a centralized database and workflow tool. This allows for a more efficient examination of all identified hosts and services, while enabling the tester to thoroughly examine RSCCD's exposed attack surface, identifying blended, multi-faceted vulnerabilities.

#### **Examination Phase**

During this phase, Optiv will perform manual and automated testing to identify potential vulnerabilities within RSCCD's network. Manual examination is performed using the host profiles that were developed during the target profiling phase. This manual testing evaluates the exposed attack surface, identifying findings that cannot be discovered using automated tools.

Detailed vulnerability scans are also performed against prioritized target groups using a unique combination of commercial, open-source, and proprietary tools. The automated and manual testing data is correlated to reduce false positives. The objective of this phase is to identify potential security findings that affect RSCCD's overall security posture. This includes the following activities:

• Testing the local network for weak client configuration or sensitive information being transmitted insecurely (Internal network only)



- Scanning hosts for known network vulnerabilities
- Using automated and manual penetration testing techniques designed to test for exploitable unauthenticated and authenticated application security issues, such as the published OWASP Top 10 application vulnerability categories
- Manually reviewing hosts, services, and applications for vulnerabilities not revealed by automated tools
- Evaluating target profiling and identified vulnerabilities to identify potential attack vectors by combining issues and performing blended attacks
- Analyzing publicly exposed data or data obtained due to identified vulnerabilities for sensitive information
- Correlating results and reduce false-positive findings
- Classifying targets based on vulnerability type and underlying root cause

Optiv uses the information gathered during this phase to update the previously established system profiles with any identified vulnerabilities. Leveraging this additional data in the centralized host profile ensures that systems are thoroughly tested using the information collected from all available sources.

#### Attack Scenario Phase

Optiv will review the identified vulnerabilities and misconfigurations to determine their impact on RSCCD's overall security posture. This validation is performed through targeted penetration testing that focuses on high-risk findings. Exploitation of these findings often yields access to critical systems and sensitive information vital to RSCCD operations. The objective of this phase is to provide the organization with a clear understanding of the risks associated with the identified findings via the following methods:

- Using automated and manual tools to exploit vulnerabilities
- Using exploited hosts to gain additional knowledge of the target network
- Identifying sensitive information or additional post-exploitation weaknesses that are exposed as a result of a risk validation scenario
- Analyzing the compromised systems, looking for exposed credentials or sensitive information that can be used in the next phase to increase access throughout the environment
- Using any new information and access, return to the Discovery Phase and re-evaluate in-scope systems that were not previously available from the original network vantage point

Optiv will review the obtained access and credentials and will look for paths where using that information can lead to achieving the test goals and access to the specified sensitive information and resources. Pivoting techniques can include:

- Targeting privileged users on the network in an attempt to hijack their escalated access
- Targeting authorized access channels with rights into the sensitive hosts and information (such as backup access, system and network management systems, etc.)
- Searching exposed network shares using the compromised host access for additional information
- Exploiting overly permissive access rights, password reuse, and domain trusts
- Using any new information and access, return to the target identification access as necessary to find additional ways to get closer to the goal
- Accessing and exfiltrating the sensitive information (goal)

The Attack Scenario and Post-Exploitation (Pivoting) phases will validate the risk exposure of identified attack vectors. Optiv will perform normal penetration testing activities during unrestricted testing windows,

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unless otherwise specified in the scoping considerations. High-risk attack scenarios always will be scheduled with RSCCD, even when limited testing windows are not otherwise specified.

Optiv's technical process uses non-destructive testing techniques (i.e., no files or data are intended to be modified or changed). Under no circumstances are Denial-of-Service (DoS) attacks used; but if DoS vulnerabilities are identified, they will be documented and recommendations will be made to correct them.

Prior to beginning the Risk Validation phase, Optiv will notify RSCCD of any tests that are recommended that may present an increased risk of service impact. This notification will present the outage risk as well as an explanation of what the test could accomplish if successful.

However, penetration testing always poses an inherent risk where the targeted vulnerable service may become unavailable. Optiv takes every precaution to limit these risks. All automated tools are run in "safe mode" and through Optiv's extensive experience running these assessments; Optiv has developed testing methodology around the primary goal of maintaining network availability. Throughout testing, Optiv actively monitors all systems and applications.

#### **Post-Assessment Retest**

Optiv will provide a retest of the in-scope network(s). The post-assessment retesting scope will include the specific high-risk findings identified in the attack scenario phase that led to initial unauthorized access.

Any changes in the IP addresses tested, or the retesting of lower-severity findings, will require a Change Order and will incur additional labor or license fees.

- Provide remediation follow-up on High vulnerabilities identified
- Update existing findings matrix with retest results

This will provide RSCCD with a matrix containing vulnerabilities found, implications, severity or risk level, and specific recommendations for remediation.

# BACKGROUND

Rancho Santiago Community College District received the Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG) – Regional Consortium Funding Appropriation (Assembly Bill No. 104) from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Funding was awarded to the Rancho Santiago Adult Education Consortium (RSAEC) that includes RSCCD as the lead and Fiscal Agent, three school districts (Santa Ana, Orange, and Garden Grove), the Orange County Department of Education, and the Orange County Sheriff's Department.

The Chancellor's Office has apportioned AEBG funds to regions throughout the state to expand and improve opportunities for educational and workforce services for adult learners. Funding will support RSAEC's AB 86 Regional Comprehensive Plan seven program areas: (1) elementary and secondary basic skills, including high school diploma or GED; (2) citizenship, English as a second language, and workforce preparation; (3) adults/older adults entry or re-entry into the workforce; (4) family literacy; (5) adults with disabilities; (6) career technical education; and (7) pre-apprenticeship training activities. The appropriation amount is \$3,079,153. The term of this appropriation is from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 that includes a three-year implementation plan cycle (fiscal years 15/16, 16/17 and 17/18).

# ANALYSIS

The enclosed sub-agreement (#DO-16-2218-05) with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools is to implement AB 104 Adult Education Block Grant activities and program development, thereby increasing adult students' transition to college and/or career readiness and vocational programs. The performance period of the sub-agreement is July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, with a total cost not to exceed \$5,250.00.

Leading the implementation of the RSAEC plan are project administrators Jose Vargas and Jim Kennedy, project director Mary Walker; and project coordinator Christine Gascon.

# **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board approve this sub-agreement and that the Vice Chancellor, Business Operations/Fiscal Services or his designee be authorized to sign and enter into a related contractual agreement on behalf of the district.

# GRANT SUB-AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND ORANGE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

This grant sub-agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into on this 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 2016, between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and the Orange County Superintendent of Schools (hereinafter "SUBCONTRACTOR"). RSCCD and SUBCONTRACTOR may be referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties" in this Agreement.

WHEREAS, RSCCD received a grant award entitled "Adult Education Block Grant Program Consortium Funding Appropriation," Prime Award #15-328-043 (hereinafter "Grant") from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (hereinafter "PRIME SPONSOR"), to disseminate implementation funds to regional consortia of community college districts, K-12 school districts, and other partner agencies, to implement regional strategies to better serve educational and workforce needs of adults;

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, SUBCONTRACTOR has agreed to participate in the purpose of this Grant according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE the Parties agree as follows:

# ARTICLE I

1. Statement of Work

SUBCONTRACTOR will provide services as described in the attached Statement of Work (**Exhibit A**), related to the *Rancho Santiago Adult Education Consortium – AB 86 Regional Comprehensive Plan*, which by this reference is incorporated into this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work, and to provide all services as set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Statement of Work in a professional, timely and diligent manner.

2. <u>Period of Performance</u>

The period of performance for this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. NOTE: The entire term of the Grant appropriation is for three years from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018 (project years 15/16, 16/17, 17/18). RSCCD will issue amendments to the Agreement on an annual basis, rather than for the entire term.

3. <u>Total Cost</u>

The total cost to RSCCD for the performance of this Agreement shall not exceed \$5,250.00 USD.

# 4. Payment

Disbursement of funds will begin upon RSCCD's receipt of the fully executed Agreement and a detailed invoice for the disbursement. RSCCD shall make reimbursement payments as long as the total payments under this Agreement do not exceed the amount listed above under Article I.3. "Total Costs".

# 5. Budget

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that the expenditures of any and all funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the Project Budget (**Exhibit B**), which by this reference is incorporated into this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR must submit a budget revision request to RSCCD if expenditures exceed ten (10) percent of the authorized project budget by budget categories; and/or adding or deleting budget categories.

# 6. Invoices

Invoices must be itemized, include the Agreement number (refer to footer), and include backup documentation for expenditures submitted for payment. Final payment is contingent upon successful completion of the Statement of Work (**Exhibit A**), upon receipt of a final invoice requesting payment due **July 15, 2016**, and the Project Director's certification of the final report. # 7. <u>Reporting</u>

- (a) Progress Reports. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to submit progress reports as requested by RSCCD and/or the PRIME SPONSOR.
- (b) Final Reports. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to submit an annual expenditure report and an annual performance report summarizing completion of the project activities consistent with the SUBCONTRACTOR'S Scope of Work (Exhibit A). The final reports are due July 15, 2016.

# 8. Expenditure of Grant Funds

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all Grant requirements and that it is solely responsible for the appropriate expenditure of all Grant appropriation funds received and for any misappropriation or disallowment of Grant appropriation funds.

# 9. <u>Time Extensions</u>

As the full term of the Grant is from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018, and amendments to the Agreement will be developed on an annual basis for the entire term of the Grant,

extensions will be addressed through annual modifications to the Agreement, including revised Scope of Works and Project Budgets, to extend the term and increase the total costs for work to be performed in the new project years: e.g., 2016/2017 and 2017/2018. NOTE: As Grant appropriation funds are only available from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2018, time extensions for use of Grant appropriation funds will be possible up to but not beyond June 30, 2018, and require approval by RSCCD.

SUBCONTRACTOR must spend all funds allocated through this Agreement within the timeframe of the Agreement listed above under Article I.2. "Period of Performance". Under this Agreement, SUBCONTRACTOR will only be reimbursed for expenses that are incurred on or prior to **June 30, 2016**.

## 10. Independent Contractor

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that the service provided hereunder is rendered in its capacity as an independent contractor and that it is not in any way an agent of RSCCD, nor shall its employees be entitled to any personnel benefits of RSCCD whatsoever.

## 11. Subcontract Assignment

Unless specifically noted in the Scope of Work (**Exhibit A**), none of the duties of, or work to be performed by, SUBCONTRACTOR under this Agreement shall be sub-contracted or assigned to any agency, consultant, or person without the prior written consent of RSCCD. No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBCONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR shall insure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with SUBCONTRACTOR guidelines.

SUBCONTRACTOR shall itemize all sub-contractor and contracted staff costs in the budget so it is clear how the funds will be allocated and spent by SUBCONTRACTOR. By entering into this Agreement SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that it is the direct provider of intended services. Upon request, SUBCONTRACTOR shall submit to RSCCD copies of all subcontracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval, that relate to this Agreement.

## 12. Record Keeping

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to maintain project records for possible audit for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment or until any audit findings have been resolved, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated.

## 13. <u>Audit</u>

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that RSCCD, the PRIME SPONSOR, the Bureau of State Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s), shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to include a similar right of RSCCD, the PRIME SPONSOR, the Bureau of State Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s) to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this Agreement.

## 14. Mutual Indemnification

Both Parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other Party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying Party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence of the non-indemnifying Party or any of its agents or employees.

## 15. Termination

Either Party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other Party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon termination, or notice thereof, the Parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of contract responsibilities, records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBCONTRACTOR'S expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, RSCCD shall provide SUBCONTRACTOR with written notification of such determination.

## 16. Disputes

In the event of a dispute between the Parties, the aggrieved Party shall notify the other Party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The Parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the Parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement shall be decided by RSCCD and/or the PRIME SPONSOR. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBCONTRACTOR. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, RSCCD receives from SUBCONTRACTOR a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBCONTRACTOR shall act in accordance with the written decision of RSCCD or the PRIME SPONSOR, whichever is the final arbiter of the dispute. The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by the State of California, and/or the PRIME SPONSOR, whichever is applicable, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations.

## BACKGROUND

The Board Policy Committee met on January 25, 2016, and asked staff to draft a policy to be placed on the February 22, 2016, board of trustees meeting agenda which would prohibit gifts to board members or employees from an individual or business that conducts business with the district. On February 16, 2016, the Board Policy Committee met again, reviewed the language and although the committee had issues with some of the language in the proposed policy, the committee requested the policy be brought to the full board for a first reading. The committee understands that two existing policies on ethics would also need to be amended to include a new gift policy approved by the board. The proposed policy was presented to the board for a first reading on February 22, 2016, and as an information item for review and comment at the March 14, 2016, board meeting as BP 3821 Gifts to Employees and Officials.

## ANALYSIS

The Board Policy Committee plans to meet on March 28, 2016, to receive further information and clarification of a policy on gifts to employees, including but not limited to information from the Academic Senate, and further review of the County of Orange and City of Santa Ana's gift ban ordinances, and report to the full board with a recommended action.
