- 11 Recommendations
- Recommendation 1,3,5,6,7,9,and 11 are Complete
- Recommendations 2, 4, 8 and 10 are in planning or under review
- Highlights

Recommendation 1: Structure of Safety and Security

- Recommended: transition from current unarmed public safety to a hybrid armed non sworn department.
- This recommendation is complete:
- 7 managers armed
- 6 current employees armed
- 3 external recruitment

Recommendation 2: Joint Training and Exercises

- Recommended: establish close working relationship with SAPD and OPD by training together whenever possible.
- This recommendation is ongoing:
- Training of armed personnel
- Communication with local agencies
- Drill planned for October 2018

Recommendation 3, 4, & 5

- Recommended 3: additional officers and supervisory coverage - complete.
- Recommended 4: Environmental Safety and Emergency Services position - planning
- Recommended 5: Formalize training in Community
 Policing for safety and security department ongoing

Recommendation 6: Written Policies and Formal Agreements

- Recommended: MOU and Mutual Aid to be developed with SAPD and OPD for planning, training, and responding to a need for local law enforcement services on RSCCD property.
- This recommendation is complete:
- LE Agreements Approved
- Policy Manual under review by CSEA & HR
- Training of armed personnel
- Regular Communication with local agencies including SAUSD and OCSD

Recommendation 7: Interoperability

- Recommended: The Director of RSCCD Security should work with local police chiefs to gain access to their existing 800 MHz radio systems in the event of a shooting on campus or an emergency.
- This recommendation is complete:
- Accomplished through partnership with countywide communication.
- Own channel and identifier
- Item to next board meeting

Recommendation 8, 9, 10, & 11

- Recommended 8: Medial and Public Relations Establish a close working relationship with the PIOs of both SAPD and OPD. Develop a marketing plan for administrators, faculty and students to be aware of what to do in case of an emergency - ongoing
- Recommended 9: Mass Communication complete
- Recommended 10: RSCCD campus safety and security and local police from SAPD and OPD must coordinate with each other in order to be prepared to respond to critical incidents such as an active shooter-ongoing
- Recommend 11: The Director of security for RSCCD become and associate member of the OC Chiefs and Sheriffs Association – community colleges cannot participate in OCOPSA
