



# Microsoft Azure Dev Tools for Teaching & Azure for Students

**Microsoft Azure Dev Tools for Teaching** and **Azure for Students** are subscription-based offerings for accredited schools and departments providing access to tools commonly used in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) programs. They provide professional developer and designer tools, software, and services from Microsoft to **all current RSCCD faculty and students**. The program has the following goals:

- *Provide access to Microsoft software and platforms:* Educators and students get access to Microsoft products and technologies, giving them choices for current and future educational opportunities.
- *Deliver outstanding value:* These subscription-based memberships provide convenient per-user license management, removing the complexity of licenses across multiple environments.
- *Software that is acquired through your Azure Dev Tools for Teaching subscription is only for instructional and research purposes; you can't use it to run the infrastructure of a department.*

### **What products are included in Microsoft Azure Dev Tools for Teaching & Azure for Students subscription?**

Your Microsoft Azure Dev Tools for Teaching & Azure for Students subscription provides you with access to certain Software Developer Tools, available to download for free. You can download this software in the [Education Hub Software section](#) of the Microsoft Azure portal.

This includes but is not limited to:

- Project Professional 2019
- Visio Professional 2019
- Visual Studio 2019 for Mac
- SQL Database
- Windows Server 2019
- Windows 10 Operating System

### **What is Azure for Students?**

In addition to the Azure Dev Tools for Teaching subscription, **Azure for Students provides \$100 credit for 12 months allowing access to more than 25 free services.**

Charges during this period are deducted from the credit. Credit status can be checked on the [Azure Sponsorships portal](#).

### **What happens once I use all of my \$100 free credit with Azure for Students?**

After you exhaust your available credit or reach the end of 12 months, your Azure subscription becomes disabled. The Azure for Students subscription is not renewable.

To continue using Azure, you may upgrade to a pay-as-you-go subscription in the [Azure portal](#). If you decide not to upgrade at the end of 12 months or after you've exhausted your \$100 credit, whichever occurs first, any products you've deployed are decommissioned and you won't be able to access them.

You have 90 days from the end of your free subscription to upgrade to a pay-as-you-go subscription.

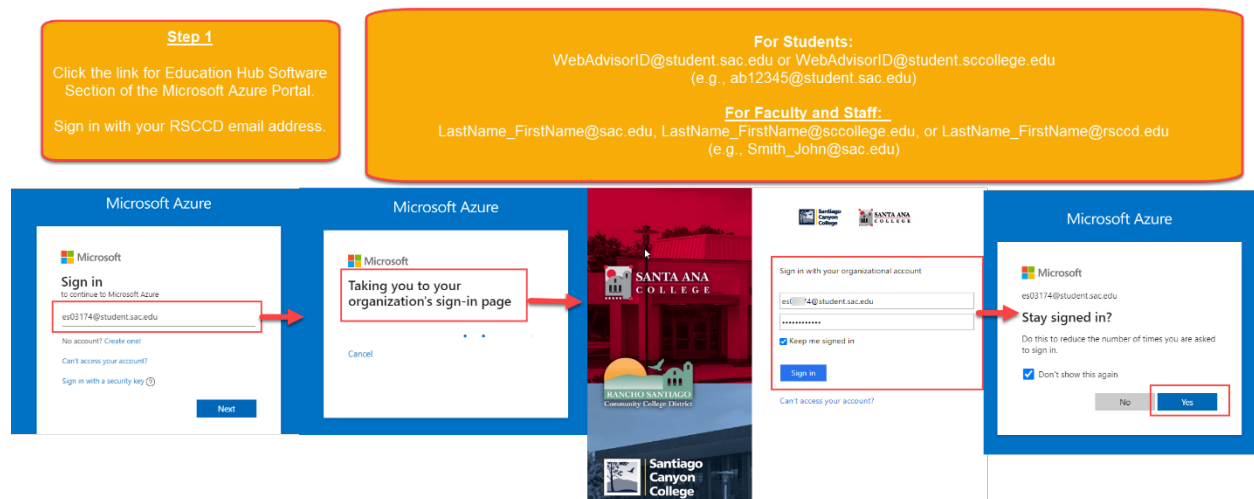

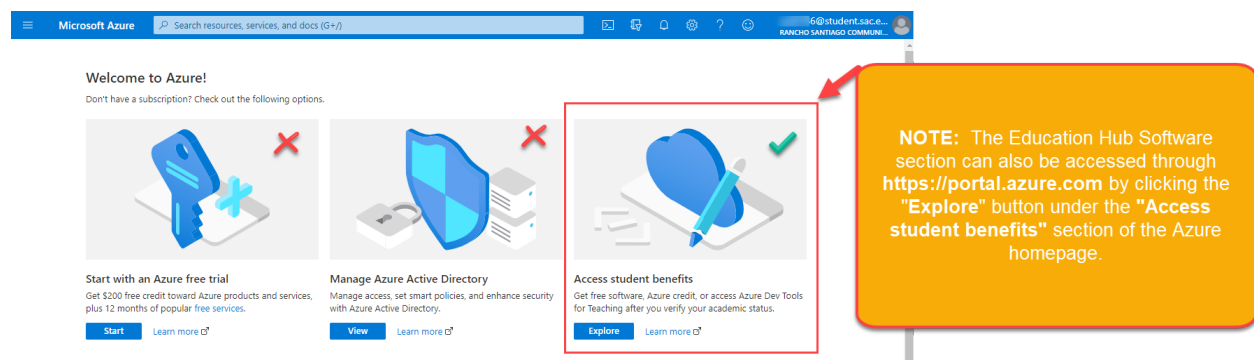

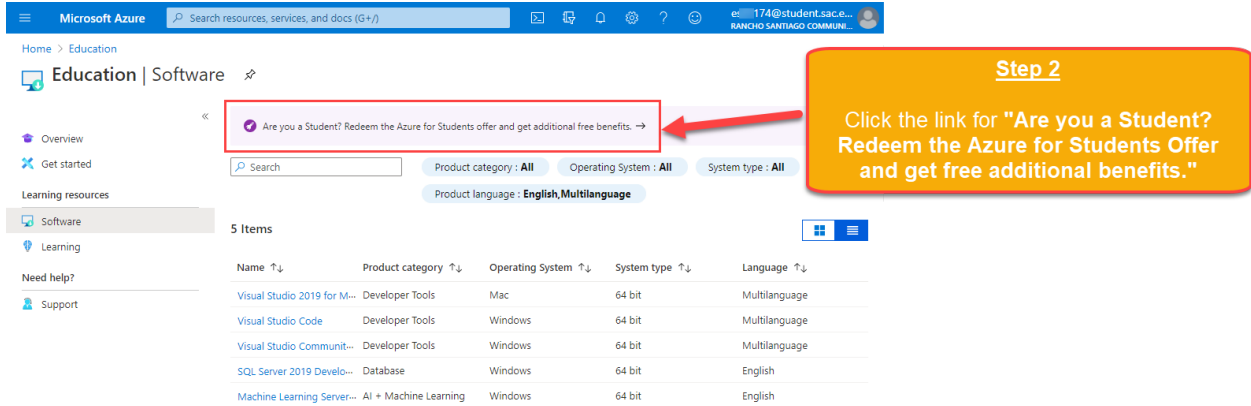

**Step 2**

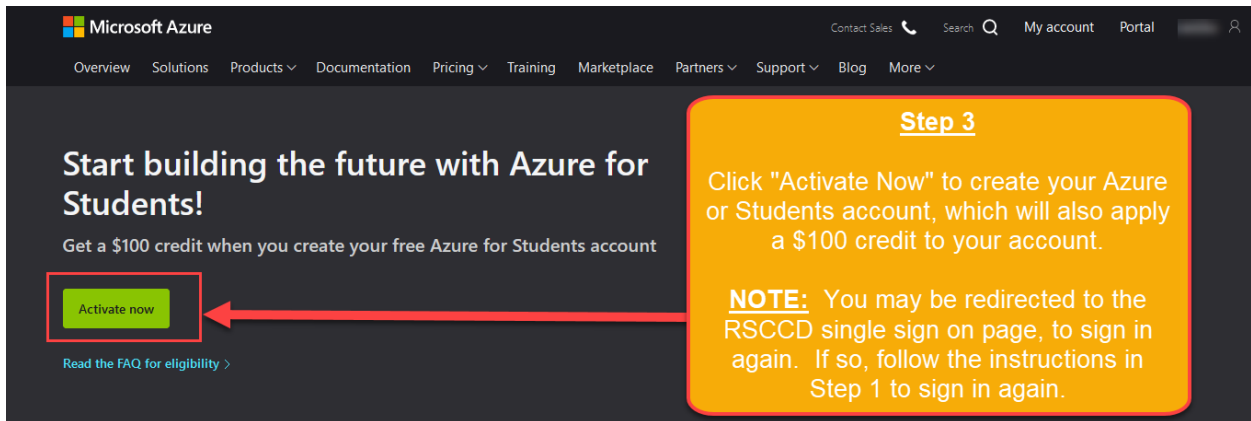
Click the link for “Are you a Student? Redeem the Azure for Students offer and get additional free benefits.”



**Step 3**

Click “Activate Now” to create your Azure for Students account, which will also apply a \$100 credit to your account.

**NOTE:** You may be redirected to the RSCCD single sign-on page, to sign in again. If so, follow the instructions in Step 1 to sign in again.



**Step 4**

Under Identity Verification by phone, choose a Country code (e.g., United states +1), and provide your phone number. Then click “Text me” or “Call me”.

Enter the Verification Code when you receive it, then click “Verify code”.
