

Santa Ana College Comparison of Learning Experiences at SAC Relating to General Education Core Competencies

Background

As educators continue to place more and more emphasis on student learning, faculty members at Santa Ana College (SAC) have identified 16 general education core competencies grouped into 6 general skill categories: communication, thinking and reasoning, information competency, diversity, life skills, and career.

Students' opinions about the contributions made by their experiences at SAC towards these goals, along with general satisfaction towards college programs and services they've used, are solicited regularly via the annual Student Satisfaction Survey (administered to students currently enrolled) and the biannual Transfer Student Survey (administered to students who transferred from SCC to a four-year college the prior year).

For the purposes of this analysis, we compared Spring 2008 survey responses reported by these students in two ways: 1) length of time spent at SAC (number of units completed), and 2) enrollment status at SAC (current students vs. students who have transferred to a four-year college).

Summary of Findings

Generally, the length of time spent at SAC (or "number of units completed") was a predictor of student perceptions about the level of the college's contributions towards student learning outcomes in only two of the 16 categories: 1) using college-level mathematical concepts and methods, and 2) producing and responding to artistic and creative expression.

When analyzed by survey group, the correlation of students' ratings of "good" and "excellent" contributions of their experiences at SAC to learning outcomes was significant in five categories: 1) speaking in a clear and organized fashion to explain ideas, feels, and conclusions, 2) formulating original ideas and concepts and integrating ideas, 3) interacting with others with integrity and awareness of others' opinions and values, 4) participating effectively in teams and groups to make decisions and seek consensus, and 5) selecting and developing a career. This

suggests that students' perceptions about the influence of their experiences at SAC on these learning outcomes are more highly influenced by proximity to attainment of their goals (or current students vs. students who have transferred to a four-year college).
