

Santiago Canyon College Division of Continuing Education Student Satisfaction Survey Results, Spring 2019

July 2019

As an educational institution, it is imperative that we regularly monitor student satisfaction to understand how particular issues, if any, impact their perception concerning program offerings and support services available to them as well as their learning environment while attending classes at the Division of Continuing Education (SCC-DCE). The findings will assist staff in supporting and retaining their students.

In late spring 2019, staff conducted an online student satisfaction survey of the students actively enrolled at the main SCC-DCE sites: SCC main campus noncredit program, the Chapman Center (CHAP) and the College and Workforce Preparation Center (CWPC). The survey provided an opportunity for students to report their levels of satisfaction with the academic programs as well as the support services available to them. In addition, the survey included questions regarding their educational background, demographics, future class offerings, and quality of services and programs.

Since the respondent populations are not uniformly distributed among the major SCC-DCE sites, Data are disaggregated by site (SCC main campus, CHAP and CWPC) to assist administrators plan appropriate programs, identify important trends in student behavior as well as use limited resources specific to the needs of the students at that location.

This report summarizes the opinions and perceptions of the 206 students who completed the survey. In addition, data from this year are compared (where appropriate) to the data collected in 2017 to assist staff in comparing current and past performance.

Summary of Results:

Respondents come from diverse demographic and economic backgrounds. About two-fifths (41%) of the respondents have had some college education prior to enrolling at SCC-DCE, even post-graduate studies, while 36% have less than a high school diploma. The majority (55%) of the respondents are older (35 years of age or older), female (58%) and Hispanic/Latino (59%). Though respondents identified many native languages, the respondents' primary languages are Spanish (46%) and English (40%).

Few students are foster youth or were in the foster care system in the past (4%), were incarcerated (3%) and others have served or are currently serving in the United States military (3%). The majority of the respondents reside in households of three or more family members (58%) with annual household income less than \$43,170 per year (50%), while more than one-half (56%) of the respondents are employed or self-employed.

Most of the respondents (72%) drive to school. While the majority of the respondents (56%) don't have access to a bus pass, about one-fifth (18%) of the respondent use public transportation and more than one-half (57%) are not interested in using transit. About one-tenth (14%) of the respondents use their free bus pass at least three times a week. About one-half of the respondents (45%) stated that riding the bus helps them avoid the hassle of finding parking at school. Most of the respondents (75%) rated their experience with riding the bus as "very good" and "good".

More than half of the respondents took classes at SCC main campus (66%) while others attended the Chapman Center (19%), the College and Workforce Preparation Center (25%). Some respondents attended multiple sites. Over one-half (52%) of the respondents have been students at SCC-DCE for less than a year, 32% for one to two years and 16% for three or more years.

Respondents reported that they come to SCC-DCE for various reasons. The top three reasons for attending are to obtain a high school diploma (37%), to obtain a better job (33%) and to learn English (31%). This marks a significant shift in attitudes, as in 2017, the primary reason for attending SCC-DCE was "to obtain a CE/computer training certificate" (61%).

- Respondents enrolled in various programs at the SCC-DCE. The top three programs of enrollment are the Adult High School Diploma (44%), the Career Education (CE)/computer-training program (28%) and English as a Second Language program (21%).
- Respondents gave SCC-DCE a rating of 95% "excellent" or "good" for overall experience! They were generally satisfied with the quality of education, the facilities, and support services they received at SCC-DCE. Highest ratings were given to "campus safety/security" (96%), "books and learning materials" and "overall experience" (95% each). Satisfaction with "books and learning materials" improved this year with an 11 percentage-point gain from 84% in 2017. The lowest rating reported was for "availability of parking" (81%) which dropped 12 percentage points from 93% in 2017.
- Respondents <u>do not</u> use many programs and services available to support them as they pursue their education.
 - More than one-half of the respondents do not use Child Care Center (68%), Student Transition Program (61%), Student Government Development Program/Leadership (59%), CalWORKS (58%) and Disabled Student Program & Services (53%).
 - The most often used services were "required" ones in which they need to select and enroll in classes, such as Admissions and Registration Office (98%) and Counseling (75%).

- Compared to 2017 survey results, this year's satisfaction ratings, in general, were higher for each support program/service listed.
 - Respondents' level of satisfaction with the programs and services available to them ranged from 91% to a high of 95% (versus 76% to 91% in 2017).
 - Admissions & Records was the highest rated service (95%) followed by Disabled Student Program & Services (94%).
 - Student Transition Program (17 percentage points), CalWORKS (14 percentage points) and Student Government Development Program/Leadership (11 percentage points) experienced the largest increases in satisfaction compared to 2017.
- Respondents were engaged while attending SCC-DCE. Nearly all of the students "strongly agreed" and "agreed" with "I would recommend SCC-DCE to a friend/family" statement (98%)! Nearly all of the respondents also "strongly agreed" and "agreed" that "they can achieve their educational goal (s)" at SCC-DCE (96%, 10-percentage point increase from 86% in 2017). "I feel a sense of belonging to this campus" statement received 87% (2-percentage point drop from 89% in 2017).
- When asked which classes they need to complete their goals, respondents listed many ranging from Adult High School Diploma (38%) to CE/computer training (36%) to Citizenship and GED/HiSET classes (6% each). In 2017, CE/computer training was at the top of the list with 95% (a drop of 59 percentage points). In contrast, Adult High School Diploma was 5% in 2017 and now is listed at the top of the respondents' list at 38% (an increase of 33 percentage points). Among these categories, there has been a shift in the need to acquire knowledge and skills for a job/career.
- The best forms of advertisement for the SCC-DCE program were word-of-mouth (family and friends; 41%, 10-percentage point increase from 2017) and the class schedule received in the mail (22%, 6-percentage point drop from 2017). Comparable to 2017 survey results, respondents stated email (70%) and text (34%) are the top methods of advertising new courses and/or programs.

Respondents were given an opportunity to make additional comments about SCC-DCE. Comments were transcribed verbatim and grouped when similar thoughts were expressed with the number of those who expressed that thought in parenthesis. There were many compliments address to staff and faculty, the quality instruction as well as the many programs and resources available to them at SCC-DCE; however, they also did not hesitate to make suggestions for improvements (such as the need for more computer training classes, advanced classes, better schedule offerings etc.). Staff are encouraged to read the comments (at the end of the report) as they are very informative.
