REQUESTS FOR A WAIVER OF TERMS MUST BE IN WRITING AND PRESENTED TO THE CITY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE AT THE TIME THIS AGREEMENT IS DELIVERED TO THE CITY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE FOR REVIEW AND APPROVAL AS TO FORM.

1.0 Services. Instructor, as an independent contractor, agrees to perform during the term of this Agreement, each and every service set forth on the "Scope of Services" attached to this Agreement as Exhibit "A." The initiation of service by the Instructor will commence upon receipt of a written notice from the Designated Official authorizing Instructor to proceed, and only to the extent of such authorization. The services of the Instructor shall include the making of all investigations, studies, and analysis required by the conditions involved in each request of the Designated Official.

2.0 Compensation. The Client shall pay for the services of Instructor either on a time-and-material basis or on a fixed-price basis, depending upon the agreed cost of the applicable service as indicated on the "Schedule of Compensation" which is set forth in Exhibit "B." No payment for expenses or labor shall be paid by Client unless it is related to a service, which is referred to in the Scope of Services. The cost of service designated on the first page of this Agreement may be increased by 10% of the original Cost of Services or \$10,000, whichever is less with the prior written approval of the Designated Official. Any additional increase in the cost of service designated on the first page of this Agreement must have the prior written approval and authorization of the City Manager.

3.0 Payment. If the service specified in the Scope of Services is to be paid for on a fixed-price basis, then Client shall pay for services of Instructor the total fixed price according to the progress payment schedule established in the Schedule of Compensation. If, however, payment is to be made on a time-and-material basis, then Instructor shall, at the end of each calendar month in which services are performed or expenses are incurred under this Agreement, and prior to the tenth day of the following month, submit to the Client a verified invoice prepared in the manner prescribed by the Client and the Designated Official. Client's payment to Instructor shall be made within thirty (30) days of either the date of completion of each phase as set forth in the progress schedule if Instructor's Compensation is a fixed price, or the date of Instructor's invoice if compensation is calculated on a time-and-material basis, whichever is applicable.

4.0 Standard of Skill. Instructor, and Instructor's staff, if any, is skilled in the professional calling necessary to perform the work agreed to be done pursuant to this Agreement. Client relies upon the skill of the Instructor, and Instructor's staff, if any, to do and perform such work in a skillful manner, and Instructor agrees to thus perform Instructor's work. The acceptance of Instructor's work by the Client shall not operate as a release of the Instructor from such standard of care and workmanship.

5.0 Independent Contractor. Instructor is retained and employed by Client only to the extent set forth in this Agreement, and the Instructor's relationship to the Client is that of an independent contractor. Instructor shall be free to dispose of all portions of Instructor's time and activities which Instructor is not obligated to devote to the Client in such a manner and to such persons, firms, or corporations as the Instructor sees fit except as expressly provided in this Agreement. Instructor shall not be considered to have the status of an employee under this Agreement or be entitled to participate in any insurance, medical care, vacation, sick leave, or other benefits provided for Client's officers or employees.

6.0 Indemnification. Instructor shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent the occurrence of any injury, including death, to any person or any damage to any property arising out

of the acts or omissions of the Instructor, its agents, employees, or subcontractors.

Instructor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Client and its officers, agents, and employees, against any claim for personal injury, property damage, or wrongful death arising out of or as the result of any work by Instructor or the employees, agents, or subcontractors of the Instructor, in the performance of this Agreement.

7.0 Termination of Agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time during the term of the Agreement by giving the other party thirty (30) days notice in writing. This Agreement may be extended beyond the term only by the written agreement of both parties prior to the expiration of the term of the Agreement.

8.0 Safety Requirement. All work performed under this Agreement shall be performed in such a manner as to provide safety to the public and to meet or exceed the safety standards outlined by CAL-OSHA. The Client reserves the right to issue restraint or cease and desist orders to the Instructor when unsafe or harmful acts are observed or reported relative to the performance of the work under this Agreement. The Instructor shall maintain the work sites free of hazards to persons and property resulting from its operations. Any hazardous condition noted by the Instructor, which is not the result of his operations, shall immediately be reported to the Client.

9.0 Insurance. Instructor shall maintain the following insurance coverage throughout the term of this Agreement, and upon request Instructor shall show Client evidence of such coverage:

9.1 Automobile Insurance. If Instructor uses, or intends to use, a personal automobile in the performance of this Agreement, automobile liability insurance with limits of not less than \$100,000.00 per person and \$300,000.00 per accident for bodily injury and not less than \$25,000.00 per accident for property damage.

9.2 Workers' Compensation Insurance. Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance on any employees of Instructor performing services under this Agreement. **This insurance cannot be waived, but does not apply if Instructor is a sole proprietor and provides a written statement to that effect.**

9.3 General Liability and Property Damage Insurance. Unless expressly waived and such waiver is evidenced by the signature of the requisite officers of the client designated in this paragraph, Instructor shall maintain general liability insurance and property damage insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit. When this coverage is required, the Client shall be named as an additional insured on a separate endorsement to the insurance policy. The endorsement shall require the insurance company to provide Client a minimum of ten (10) days notice of the cancellation of the policy.

10.0 Miscellaneous Insurance Requirements.

10.1 Recovery from Instructor 's Insurance. Instructor agrees that in the event of loss due to any of the perils for which it has agreed to provide insurance, the Instructor shall look solely to its insurance for recovery.

10.2 Failure to Secure. If Instructor at any time during the term of this Agreement, should fail to secure or maintain any insurance required under this Agreement, the Client shall be permitted to obtain such insurance in the Instructor 's name or as an agent of the Instructor and shall be compensated by the Instructor for the cost of the insurance premiums at the maximum rate permitted by law computed from the date written notice is received that the premiums have been paid. Such costs can be assessed by deducting such costs from any amounts due and payable to the Instructor as compensation under the terms of this Agreement.

10.3 Additional Insured. The naming of an additional insured shall not affect any recovery to which such additional insured would be entitled under this policy if not named as an additional insured and an additional insured named under this Agreement shall not be held liable for any premium or expense of any nature on this policy or any extension thereof. Any other insurance held by an additional insured shall not be required to contribute toward any loss or expense covered by the insurance provided by this policy. Proceeds from any policy or policies shall be payable to the Client primarily, and to the Instructor secondarily, if necessary.

10.4 Evidence of Insurance. If requested by Client, Instructor shall furnish Certificates of Insurance evidencing the required coverages or the original of the insurance policies for review by the Client or the Designated Official.

11.0 Work Product.

11.1 Deliverables. Instructor shall deliver to the Client the studies, plans, specifications, or other documents as are identified in the Scope of Services; and Instructor shall, upon completion of all work, submit to the Client all information developed in the course of the Instructor's services. Instructor shall, in such time and in such form as the Client may require, furnish reports concerning the status of services required under this Agreement. Instructor shall, upon request by Client and upon completion or termination of this Agreement, deliver to the Client all material furnished to Instructor by the Client.

11.2 Ownership. Each and every report, draft, work product, map, record, and other document reproduced, prepared, or caused to be prepared by the Instructor pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement shall be the exclusive property of the Client.

11.3 Confidentiality. Instructor may be granted access to information that is exempt from disclosure to the public (Government Code Section 6254 and 6254.16) and may contain "trade secrets" (see Government Code Section 6254.7) when it is necessary for Instructor to perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement. If Instructor is granted such access to confidential information, Instructor shall not be considered to be a member of the public as that term is used in Government Code Section 6254.5.

Instructor shall not disclose, publish, or authorize others to disclose or publish, design data, drawings, specifications, reports, or other information pertaining to the projects assigned to Instructor by the Client or other information to which the Instructor has had access during the term of this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Designated Official during the term of this Agreement and for a period of two (2) years after the termination of this Agreement.

11.4 Records. Instructor shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to sales, costs, expenses, receipts, and other such information required by the Client or the Designated Official. The Instructor shall maintain adequate records on services provided in sufficient detail to permit an evaluation of services. All such records shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall be clearly identified and readily accessible. Instructor shall provide access to the Designated Official or his designees at all proper times to such books and records, and gives the Designated Official or his designees the right to examine and audit such books and records and to make transcripts as necessary, and to allow inspection of all work, data, documents, proceedings, and activities related to this Agreement.

12.0 **Assignment.** This Agreement is personal to the Instructor. Any attempt at assignment by the Instructor shall be void unless approved in writing by the Designated Official. Instructor's services pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by the Representative or directly under the supervision of the Representative and Instructor shall not assign another to supervise the Instructor's performance of this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Client, by and through the Designated Official.

13.0 **Miscellaneous Terms.**

13.1 **Nuisance.** Instructor shall not maintain, commit, or permit the maintenance or commission of any nuisance in connection with the performance of services under this Agreement.

13.2 **Permits and Licenses.** Instructor, at its sole expense, shall obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement, all appropriate permits, licenses, and certificates that may be required in connection with the performance of services under this Agreement.

13.3 **Conflict of Interest.** Instructor agrees to be familiar with and comply with all applicable federal, state, and local conflict of interest laws.

13.4 **Waiver.** A waiver by the Client of any breach of any term, covenant, or condition contained in this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition contained in this Agreement whether of the same or different character.

13.5 **Notices.** Any notice required by this Agreement to be given in writing to the persons, at the addresses specified on the first page of this Agreement. Either party may change the specified person or address at which it is to receive notices by so advising the other party in writing.

13.6 **Mediation.** The parties agree to submit all claims, disputes or other matters in question between the parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement or breach thereof to mediation prior to the institution of any litigation.

13.7 **Cost of Litigation.** If any legal action is necessary to enforce any provision of this Agreement or for damages by reason of an alleged breach of any provisions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to receive from the losing party all costs and expenses in such amount as the court may determine to be reasonable. In awarding the cost of litigation, the court shall not be bound by any court fee schedule, but shall, if it is in the interest of justice to do so, award the full amount of costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees paid or incurred in good faith.

13.8 **Severability.** If any part, term, or provision of this Agreement shall be held illegal, unenforceable, or in conflict with any law of a federal, state, or local governmental having jurisdiction over this Agreement, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected by such holding.

13.9 Governing Law. The terms of this Agreement shall be interpreted according to the laws of the State of California. Should litigation occur, venue shall be in the Superior Court of Los Angeles County.

13.10 Integrated Contract. This Agreement represents the entire Agreement between the Client and the Instructor. No verbal agreement or implied covenant shall be held to vary the provisions of this Agreement. In the event an inconsistency arises between any exhibit and any term of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall prevail. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement and any subsequent successors and assigns.

In recognition of the obligations stated in this Agreement, the parties have executed this Agreement on the date indicated above.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Instructor, as an independent contractor, agrees to perform during the term of this Agreement, a Wellness Class for the City of Burbank Fire/Police Departments on behalf of the Management Services Department. The estimated number of students that will participate in the class will be approximately 300. The Wellness Class will begin in July 2012 and be completed in June 2013. The class will include the following:

The Fitness Assessment will include a 12-lead ECG, graded exercise test, blood pressure, pulmonary function, body composition assessment, and various strength and flexibility tests. This is a fitness evaluation not a medical assessment a doctor does not evaluate the results. Students are encouraged to take their individualized fitness profile to their doctor for review.

Individualized Fitness Assessment Results Profile will be provided to each participant.

A minimum of 4 lectures/workshops on health, fitness, and nutrition topic will be given during the duration of the Wellness Class. Classes will be repeated two times for each shift for a total of 6 lectures/workshops to cover each topic.

Students enrolled in the Wellness Class also have access to registered dietitians, exercise physiologists, and athletic trainers throughout the year. Individual and small group sessions will be arranged throughout the class (July 2012 through June 2013) upon request. There will be no additional costs for this service.

The Management Services Department's Assistant Management Services Director-Risk Management & Safety will receive an aggregate report showing the Fire & Police Department's average fitness scores in the following areas: Cardiovascular fitness, muscular fitness, body composition, and coronary risk.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Professional Services Agreement, entered into this 11th day of September, 2012 (the "Execution Date"), by and between the CITY OF SANTA MONICA, a municipal corporation ("City"), and **Santa Ana College** ("Instructor"), is made with reference to the following:

RECITALS:

A. The City is a municipal corporation duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of California with the power to carry on its business as it is now being conducted under the statutes of the State of California and the Charter of the City.

B. The Instructor is qualified to do business, and is doing business, in the State of California. Instructor represents it has the background, knowledge, experience and expertise necessary to provide the services set forth in this Agreement.

C. The City and Instructor desire to enter into an agreement for the Instructor to provide professional services to the City as set forth herein, upon the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the undersigned parties as follows:

AGREEMENT

SECTION 1. TERM.

This Agreement shall commence on the Execution Date, and shall terminate upon the completion of the services required by this Agreement, or the 27th day of August 2013, whichever is earlier, unless terminated earlier as set forth herein.

SECTION 2. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY INSTRUCTOR.

Instructor shall perform all of the services ("Services") that are more fully set forth in Exhibit A, Scope of Services, attached hereto and incorporated herein. The Services shall be completed in accordance with Exhibit B, Budget, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 3. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY CITY.

City shall perform the following services:

- A. Make available to Instructor any currently existing documents, data or information pertinent to the Services.
- B. Designate a representative authorized to act on behalf of City.
- C. Promptly examine and render findings on all documents submitted for staff review by Instructor.

SECTION 4. COMPENSATION.

Instructor shall be compensated for Services performed pursuant to this Agreement in an amount not to exceed **fourteen thousand two hundred and eighty Dollars and no cents (\$14,280.00)**, as set forth in Exhibit B, Budget.

SECTION 5. NOTICES.

All notices, demands, requests or approvals to be given under this Agreement, shall be given in writing and conclusively shall be deemed served when delivered personally or on the third business day after deposit in the United States mail, postage prepaid, registered or certified, addressed as follows:

SECTION 6. INDEPENDENT PARTIES.

Both parties to this Agreement will be acting in an independent capacity and not as agents, employees, partners, or joint venturers of one another. Neither the City nor its officers or employees shall have any control over the conduct of Instructor or any of Instructor's agents, employees, or subconsultants, except as otherwise provided herein.

SECTION 7. INTEGRATED CONTACT.

This Agreement represents the full and complete understanding of every kind or nature whatsoever between the parties hereto, and all preliminary negotiations and agreements of whatsoever kind or nature are merged herein. No verbal agreement or implied covenant shall be held to vary the provisions hereof. Any modifications of this Agreement will be effective only by written execution signed by both City and Instructor, and approved as to form by the City Attorney.

SECTION 8. INSURANCE.

Prior to commencing work, Instructor shall procure, maintain and pay for insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work or services hereunder by Instructor and Instructor's agents, representatives, employees or subconsultants for the duration of this Agreement. The requirements of insurance are set forth in Exhibit C, Insurance Requirements and Verifications, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 9. COST OF LITIGATION.

If any legal action is necessary to enforce any provision of this Agreement or for damages by reason of any alleged breach of any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to receive from the losing party all reasonable costs, disbursements and expenses, and such amount as the court may adjudge to be reasonable attorney's fees.

SECTION 10. DEFENSE, INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS.

Instructor shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City, its City Council, boards and commissions, officers, agents and employees (collectively hereafter the "City") against any or all loss, damages, liability, claims, suits, costs, expenses, and judgments, whatsoever, including reasonable attorney's fees, arising from the negligent or willful acts, errors or omissions of Instructor or Instructor's officers, agents, employees or subconsultants, in the performance of services, activities or work conducted pursuant to this Agreement.

Instructor shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City, from and against any and all claims and losses whatsoever, including reasonable attorney's fees occurring to or resulting from any and all persons, firms, or corporations employed or contracted by the Instructor or Instructor's subconsultants in connection with Instructor's services under this Agreement.

SECTION 11. PROHIBITION AGAINST TRANSFERS.

Instructor shall not assign, hypothecate, or transfer this Agreement or any interest therein directly or indirectly, by operation of law or otherwise without the prior written consent of City. Any attempt to do so without the City's consent shall be null and void, and any assignee, sublessee, hypothecatee or transferee shall acquire no right or interest by reason of such attempted assignment, sublease, hypothecation or transfer.

The sale, assignment, transfer or other disposition of any of the issued and outstanding capital stock of Instructor or of any general partner or joint venturer or syndicate member of Instructor, if a partnership or joint venture or syndicate exists, which shall result in changing the control of Instructor, shall be construed as an assignment of this Agreement. Control means fifty percent (50%) or more of the voting power of the corporation.

SECTION 12. PERMITS AND LICENSES.

Instructor, at its sole expense, shall obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement all required business and professional permits, licenses and certificates.

SECTION 13. WAIVER.

A waiver by either party to this Agreement of any breach of any term, covenant, or condition contained herein shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition contained herein.

SECTION 14. TERMINATION.

In the event Instructor fails or refuses to perform any of the provisions of this Agreement, and if the default is not cured within a period of five (5) days after receipt by Instructor of City's written notice of default specifying the nature of the default and the steps necessary to cure the default, City may immediately terminate this Agreement by written notice. City shall have the option, at its sole discretion and without cause, of terminating this Agreement by giving ten (10) days written notice to Instructor. Upon termination of this Agreement, City shall pay to Instructor compensation earned and unpaid up to the effective date of termination.

SECTION 15. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW.

Instructor shall comply with all laws of the State of California and the United States, and all ordinances, rules and regulations enacted or issued by City. If such ordinances, rules or regulations enacted or issued by the City after the effective date of this Agreement significantly impact Instructor's performance of its obligations under this Agreement, equitable adjustment may be made to the time of performance, the compensation, or both, as appropriate.

SECTION 16. SANTA MONICA LIVING WAGE ORDINANCE.

This Agreement (☐ is ☒ is not) subject to the City of Santa Monica's Living Wage Ordinance, Santa Monica Municipal Code Chapter 4.65 ("Living Wage Ordinance") which requires the payment of Minimum Wage for work done on any contract to any worker who does not actually work as a manager, supervisor or confidential employee, and who is not required to possess an occupational license. The Living Wage Ordinance sets the Minimum Wage at \$13.27 per hour and provides for an annual adjustment each July 1st, by an amount corresponding to the previous calendar year's change in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers in Los Angeles, Riverside and Orange Counties. If this Agreement is subject to such Living Wage Ordinance, then the Instructor shall comply with all of its provisions. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Living Wage Ordinance shall be grounds for termination of this Agreement. Questions concerning the Living Wage Ordinance may be directed to the City Finance Department at (310) 458-8281.

SECTION 17. DISCRIMINATION.

Instructor shall not discriminate in the provision of services hereunder because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, age, sexual orientation, marital status, AIDS or disability, and shall comply with the requirements of City, state and federal law.

SECTION 18. NUISANCE.

Instructor shall not maintain, commit, or permit the maintenance or commission of any nuisance in connection with the performance of services under this Agreement.

SECTION 19. RECORDS.

Instructor shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to costs, expenses, receipts and other such information required by the City for any services provided where compensation is on the basis of hourly rates, sub consultant costs, and/or other direct costs.

Instructor shall maintain records of service provided in sufficient detail to permit an evaluation of services. All records shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall be clearly identified and readily accessible. Representatives of City or its designees shall be allowed free access to Instructor's books and records, and shall have the right to examine, audit and make transcripts therefrom as necessary, and to inspect all work, data, documents, proceedings and activities related to this Agreement. Such records, together with supporting documents, shall be kept separate from other documents and records and shall be maintained for a period of three (3) years after receipt of final payment.

If City's audit discloses an error of five percent (5%) or more in information reported by Instructor and City's audit is correct, Instructor shall pay the cost of City's audit computed on the basis of four (4) times the direct payroll of the audit staff completing the audit and audit report.

SECTION 20. REPORTS.

Each and every final report, work product, map, record and other document reproduced, prepared by caused to be prepared by Instructor pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement and delivered to the City shall be the exclusive property of City, including the originals of all notes, memoranda, sketches, letters and documents developed and received by Instructor excluding medical reports and fitness reports containing medical information in accordance with current HIPPA laws. The Instructor will provide an aggregate report with group norms and statistics.

Instructor shall furnish reports concerning the status of services required under this Agreement at City's request. No report, work product, map, record or other document given to or prepared or assembled by Instructor pursuant to this Agreement shall be made available to any individual or organization by Instructor without prior written approval by City. City shall not reuse or make any modifications to the designs, plans and specifications prepared by Instructor without the prior authorization of Instructor. The provisions of this Section shall apply to all materials developed by subconsultants pursuant to this Agreement unless otherwise authorized in writing by City prior to execution of any agreement with said subconsultants.

SECTION 21. STANDARD OF CARE.

Instructor agrees that all services performed hereunder, including services performed by any sub consultant, shall be provided in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of Instructor's profession currently practicing in the same locality under similar conditions.

SECTION 22. SUB INSTRUCTOR/CONSULTANTS.

Requests for sub-instructor/consultants shall be submitted in writing, describing the scope of work to be contracted, the name of the proposed sub-instructor/consultant, and the total price or hourly rates used in preparing an estimated cost for the sub-instructor/consultant's services. The City may issue approval of the sub-instructor/consultant in the form of a Work Order.

Instructor shall be responsible for the quality of all sub-instructor/consultant work performed pursuant to this Agreement. Instructor may terminate and replace the services of any sub-instructor/consultant, subject to the prior written approval by the City which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Every subcontract or agreement of any kind entered into between Instructor and sub-instructor/consultant (or between any sub-instructor/consultant and others) shall contain the following provision:

This agreement is consistent with the specified terms and conditions of the Agreement entered into between the City of Santa Monica and _____ on _____ (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement") including, but not limited to: Section 2, Services to be Performed by Consultant; Section 4, Compensation; and Section 8, Insurance.

SECTION 23. GOVERNING LAW.

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of California.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Santa Ana College will provide a comprehensive Wellness Class for the Santa Monica Fire Department that includes a fitness evaluation, blood draw, and a minimum of 4 lectures/workshops on health, fitness, and nutrition topics.

The Fitness Assessment includes a graded exercise test on a treadmill to determine aerobic fitness, various strength and flexibility tests to determine muscle fitness, and a body composition evaluation to determine percent body fat. A resting and exercise 12 lead ECG, resting and exercise blood pressure, various pulmonary function and blood test values will be recorded and included in the fitness profile. This is a fitness assessment not a medical evaluation; the college does not provide medical review of results. All participants are encouraged to take their individual profile results to their personal doctor for review by a medical professional.

A minimum of 4 lectures/workshops will be given during the duration of the Wellness Class. These classes will be repeated two to three times for each shift depending on the training calendar. Students enrolled in the Wellness Class also have access to registered dietitians, exercise physiologists, and athletic trainers throughout the year. Individual and small group consultations can also be arranged upon request. There will be no additional costs for this service.

The Wellness Classes, fitness evaluation, blood tests, and access to professionals in the field will be used to assist the individual fire fighter in assessing their overall Wellness. The fire fighter will be able to develop a personal and job specific prescription for fitness and a healthier lifestyle.

The blood draw and blood test results will be performed by West Pacific Medical Lab. The blood panel will include a Comprehensive Metabolic Panel, Blood Lipids, and Complete Blood Count. The blood lipid results will be used to assist in each individual's Wellness Plan. These results should be reviewed by the individual's doctor.

EXHIBIT C

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS AND VERIFICATION

Professional Services Insurance Requirements (for Non Public Works Contracts)

Consultant's Insurance

Prior to commencing work, the Consultant shall procure and maintain at Consultant's own cost and expense for the duration of the Agreement insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work or services hereunder by the Consultant and its agents, representatives, employees, or subconsultants. The cost of such insurance shall be included in Consultant's bid.

Without in any way affecting the indemnity provided, the Consultant shall secure before commencement of the work and throughout the Agreement the following types and amounts of insurance:

Minimum Limits of Insurance

Consultant shall obtain insurance of the types and in the amounts described below:

- 1) **Commercial General Liability Insurance**
Consultant shall maintain commercial general liability insurance (CGL) with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence/\$2,000,000 in the annual aggregate.
- 2) **Business Auto Liability Insurance**
Consultant shall maintain business auto liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident.
- 3) **Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions) Insurance**
Consultant shall maintain professional liability insurance appropriate to the consultant's profession with a limit not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence/\$1,000,000 in the annual aggregate. Architects' and engineers' coverage is to be endorsed to include contractual liability.
- 4) **Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance**
Instructor shall maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.

Minimum Scope of Insurance

- 1) CGL insurance shall be written on Insurance Services Office form CG 00 01 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury and advertising injury liability assumed under an insured contract (including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract), and explosion, collapse and underground hazards.
- 2) Business Auto Insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired, and non-owned autos). Coverage shall be written on Insurance Services Office form CA 00 01, CA 00 05, CA 00 12, CA 00 20, or a substitute form providing equivalent liability coverage. If necessary, the policy shall be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage equivalent to that provided in the 1990 and later editions of CA 00 01.
- 3) If the Professional Liability Insurance policy is written on a claims made basis, it shall be maintained continuously for a period of no less than three (3) years after final completion. The "Retro Date" must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or beginning of contract work.

Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions

Any deductibles or self -insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City of Santa Monica. At the option of the City of Santa Monica, either: the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the City of Santa Monica, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers; or the Instructor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the City of Santa Monica guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigation, claim administration and defense expenses.

Other Insurance Provisions

The general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

- 1) The City of Santa Monica, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by or on behalf of the Instructor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Instructor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. Under the CGL policy, using the Insurance Services Office additional insured endorsement form CG 20 26 or a substitute providing equivalent coverage. City and other additional insureds

mentioned in this paragraph shall not, by reason of their inclusion as additional insureds, become liable for any payment of premiums to carriers for such coverage.

- 2) For any claims related to this project, the Instructor's insurance coverage shall be primary as respects the City of Santa Monica, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City of Santa Monica, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be in excess of the Instructor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 3) Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code.

General Liability, Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability

Santa Ana College shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the City of Santa Monica, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers for losses arising from activities and operations of Instructor in the performance of services under the contract.

All Coverages

- 1) Each insurance required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the City as set forth in the notice requirement of this Agreement.
- 2) If Instructor, for any reason, fails to maintain insurance coverage which is required pursuant to this Agreement, the same shall be deemed a material breach of contract. City, at its sole option, may terminate this Agreement and obtain damages from the Instructor resulting from said breach. Alternatively, City may purchase such coverage (but has no special obligation to do so), and without further notice to the Instructor, City may deduct from sums due to the Instructor any premium costs advanced by the City for such insurance.

Acceptability of Insurers

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:6 unless otherwise approved by the City's Risk Manager.

Verification of Coverage

Instructor shall furnish the City of Santa Monica with original certificates and amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this section. The certificates and endorsements for each policy are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The certificates and endorsements should be on forms provided by the City of Santa Monica or on other than the City of Santa Monica's forms, provided those forms and endorsements conform to the requirements. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the City of Santa Monica before work commences. The City of Santa Monica reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements effecting the coverage required by these specifications at any time.

Sub-instructors/consultants

Instructor shall include all sub-instructor/consultants as insureds under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each sub-instructor/consultant. All coverages for sub-instructor/consultant shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.

This agreement, when duly executed and approved by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), establishes an affiliation between VA, its Veterans Integrated Service Networks, the listed VA facility or facilities, and the listed educational program for the academic purposes of enhanced patient care, education, and research. VA and the affiliated educational institution have a shared responsibility for the academic enterprise. Ultimate responsibility for the control and operation of VA facilities and programs rests with VA. Ultimate responsibility for academic education rests with the affiliated institution. Additional responsibilities are delineated below.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

Ultimate responsibility for the control and operation of VA facilities and programs rests with VA. Ultimate responsibility for academic education rests with the participating institutions. Through this agreement, a partnership is created to enable enhanced patient care, education, and research.

The participating institutions and VA comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Public Law 104-91, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and all related regulations, and assures that they do not, and will not, discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, sex, disability, or age under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.

Nothing in this agreement is intended to be contrary to state or federal laws. In the event of conflict between terms of this agreement and any applicable state or federal law, that state or federal law will supersede the terms of this agreement. In the event of conflict between state and federal law, federal law will govern.

Faculty members and trainees of the sponsoring institutions, when at VA health care facilities or on VA assignment at offsite facilities and while furnishing professional services covered by this agreement, will have personal liability protection by the provisions of the Federal Employees Liability Reform and Tort Compensation Act, 28 U.S.C. 2679 (b)-(d).

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The affiliated educational institution has the following responsibilities:

- A. Operate, manage, and assume overall educational responsibilities for the educational program and maintain accreditation by an agency that is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).
- B. Enable faculty appointments for VA staff.
- C. Select trainees that meet qualifications as agreed upon by the school and VA.
- D. Evaluate the trainee's performance and conduct in mutual consultation with VA staff and according to the guidelines outlined in the approved curriculum and accepted standards.
- E. Develop educational program letters of agreement for each VA health care facility that provides a trainee with educational experience at VA. These agreements must identify faculty, including VA employees, who will teach, supervise, and evaluate trainee performance; outline educational objectives; specify periods and clinical area of assignments.

2. VA has the following responsibilities:

- A. Operate and manage the VA facility and maintain accreditation by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) and other accrediting entities.
- B. Appoint qualified health care professionals, as appropriate, as full-time or part-time staff of the facility, which will provide supervision of trainees and provide veteran patient care.
- C. Participate with the affiliated school in the academic programs of education and research, provide an appropriate learning environment, and supply sufficient resources for appropriate conduct of such programs.
- D. Establish minimal qualifications for trainees coming to VA for academic programs.
- E. Evaluate the trainee's performance and conduct in mutual consultation with the program director and according to the guidelines outlined in the approved curriculum and accepted standards.
- F. Orient trainees and faculty to the VA facility and inform them that they are subject to VA rules and regulations while in a VA facility.
- G. Trainees are not considered employees, but for dismissal process, may be dismissed from VA assignment in accordance with VA Handbook 5021, Part VI, and Paragraph 15."
- H. Ensure that all trainees who will be assigned to VA receive appropriate VA appointments.
- I. Assure that staff with appropriate credentials will supervise trainees.
- J. Encourage faculty appointments at the sponsoring institution for VA staff.
- K. Appoint VA staff and appropriate school program faculty to the VA Partnership Council and its subcommittees. School program faculty will be chosen based on the extent of involvement in the VA training program and geographic proximity to the VA facility.
- L. Conduct periodic reviews of academic programs and policies according to VA policies.

TERMINATION OF AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

This affiliation agreement is in force until further notice and supersedes any previous affiliation agreement, it that may be in place. It may be terminated in writing at any time by mutual consent with due consideration of patient care and educational commitments, or by written notice by either party 6 months in advance of the next training experience. This agreement has been executed on February 14, 2012.

BACKGROUND

Attached is a list of students who have completed coursework at Santa Ana College leading to the Associate Degree and/or Certificate for spring 2012.

ANALYSIS

Santa Ana College awarded 881 Associate Degrees at the conclusion of the spring 2012 semester, 624 Associate in Arts and 218 Associate in Science. This is up 72 degrees from spring 2011 in which 809 Associate Degrees were conferred. The area that showed significant increase was Liberal Arts. The area that showed the most significant decrease was Art.

Santa Ana College awarded 722 Certificates of Achievement/Accomplishment at the conclusion of the spring 2012 semester. This is up 83 certificates from spring 2011 in which 639 Certificates of Achievement/Accomplishment were conferred. The area with the most significant increase in certificates was Education – After School Program Assistant.

BACKGROUND

Attached is a list of students who successfully completed coursework at Santiago Canyon College leading to an associate degree, certificate of achievement, and/or certificate of proficiency for spring 2012. Also attached are the statistical tables showing degrees and certificates awarded.

ANALYSIS

Santiago Canyon College awarded 564 associate degrees in spring 2012, compared to 400 in spring 2011. Two of these degrees were in the Associate in Arts for Transfer in Communication Studies (AA-T). The most significant increase is in the area of Liberal Arts with an increase of 160 degrees compared to spring 2011. The other programs with an increase of five or more are Business Administration, Psychology, and Science. All other programs sustained the same rudimentary numbers between spring 2012 and spring 2011.

Santiago Canyon College awarded 496 Certificates of Achievement in spring 2012, as compared to 425 in spring 2011. A total of 28 Certificates of Proficiency were awarded in spring 2012, as compared to 25 in spring 2011. Notable increases are seen in Apprenticeship Electricity (Industrial and Sound Installer), Apprenticeship Surveying (Chief of Party), CSU and IGETC General Education Breadth, Education: After School Program Assistant, and all Water Utility Science programs.

The number of students who received multiple degrees increased dramatically. This was the most significant contribution to the increase in the number of degrees awarded. On average about 21 students earned multiple degrees in any given semester. In spring 2012 there were 139 students who received two or more degrees.

The increase in the number of Certificates of Achievement awarded is a reflection of the hard work by the Division of Business and Career Technical Education (BCTE) in identifying which students have completed program requirements. The increase in the number of Certificates in Proficiency is reflective of the first cohort of students completing the Education: After School Program Assistant program.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the recipients of the associate degrees and certificates for the spring 2012 as presented.

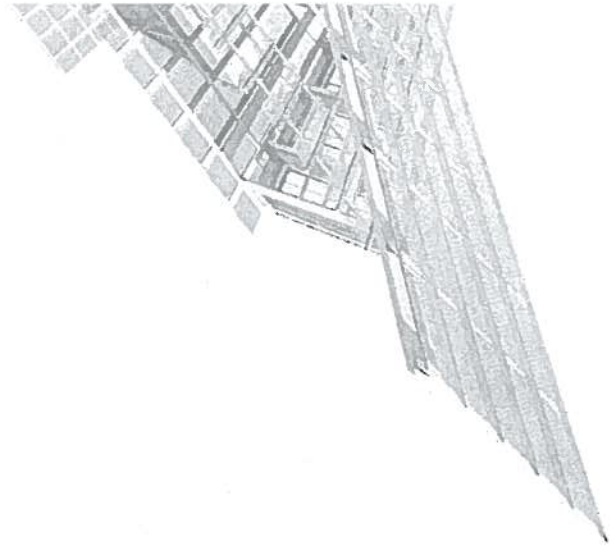

WHEREAS, it would work an incongruity and not produce any advantage to the District to competitively bid the Change Order since such competitive bid work could result in multiple contractors being required to perform work more efficiently and effectively performed by one contractor; and

WHEREAS, Meakin v. Steveland (1977) 68 Cal.App.3d 490 and Los Angeles Dredging v. Long Beach (1930) 210 Cal. 348 holds that statutes requiring competitive bidding do not apply when competitive bidding would work an incongruity or not produce any advantage.

BACKGROUND

The construction of the new Athletic/Aquatic Complex at Santiago Canyon College (SCC) is expected to be completed within the next two months. The center includes a swimming pool, three basketball/volleyball courts, a fitness center, an aerobics room, athletic training room, and equipment room. Since this is the first athletic center on the campus, we have to purchase a considerable amount of supplies and equipment. SCC will be utilizing some of the equipment from the existing fitness center; however, anticipating the construction of the new facility, we have not made any major purchases of equipment for the last five years.

Bid #1190 has 180 items and, at this time, we are asking approval for a partial award of 162 items awarded to the low bidders meeting specifications. The remaining items (substitutions) require additional time for evaluation to make sure they meet specifications. These items will be taken to the Board for approval at a later date.

ANALYSIS

Bids were emailed to 37 vendors. We received 12 bids; however, one was considered non-responsive due to an omitted bid form.

The bids have been reviewed by the SCC campus committee and items will be awarded to the low bidders meeting specifications with the exceptions of Items 49-51, 80-87, 97-101, 103-105, 107-108, 110-113, 115-116, 118-122, 140-155, and 157-158. There were no bids for these items. Items 64, 91, 93, 167-169, and 172 are being removed either because they are duplicate items or are no longer needed. Items 9, 15, 17, 19, and 21-33 are still being evaluated. Item 156 is rejected because there was only one bid and it is unacceptable.

This is a multiple-award bid. Attached are the bid results with the recommended awards noted with a checkmark (✓).
