- 1) **What is the 5% reserve – 5% of? Expenses? If so which expenses? \$8,869,565 is our 16-17 5% reserve. So what is the \$177,391,300 comprised of? I would like to know how to accurately calculate the 5% reserve.**
  - The 5% Board Policy Contingency is calculated on the total unrestricted general fund expenditures. It is a simple calculation of the total 1000-7000 budgeted expenditures for Fund 11 and 13 found on page 17. However, this year we have deducted the \$4 million STRS on behalf amount as it is not a true expenditure. So,  $\$181,391,035 - \$4,000,000 = \$177,391,035 \times 5\% = \$8,869,552$ . It calculates \$13 different from the amount shown as \$8,869,565 as we had one final expenditure reconciling item when we were finishing the budget due to rounding.

- Santa Ana College has budgeted a portion of their one-time carryovers from unspent funds in 2015/16 in line 1300 part time adjunct faculty salaries to offer

additional courses in 2016/17 in an attempt to grow the amount of Full Time Equivalent Students served.

# EDUCATIONAL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

## Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

**THIS AGREEMENT** is made and entered into by and between **West Anaheim Extended Care**, hereinafter called the Agency, and **Rancho Santiago Community College District on behalf of Santa Ana College**, hereinafter called the District.

### PART I. BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS**, the District and Agency acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education for the benefit for students and to meet community needs.

**WHEREAS**, the District provides programs in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education, which require clinical experience for students, enrolled in these programs.

**WHEREAS**, the Agency has facilities suitable for the clinical needs of the District programs in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

**WHEREAS**, it is to the benefit of both District and Agency that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have opportunities for clinical experience to enhance their capabilities as practitioners.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the District and Agency do covenant and agree as follows:

### PART II. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE COLLEGE

#### A. For the Program in General

1. The District will assume full responsibility for offering Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education programs eligible for accreditation by the appropriate State Board.
2. District faculty members may be invited to serve as voluntary resource persons to the Agency staff by serving on Occupational Therapy Assistant Program care committees, by sharing knowledge as clinical experts, and by participation in other matters dealing with the quality of patient care.
3. For Background clearance  
The District shall inform The Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students of the Background Check requirement and their responsibility of payment.

**B. For Program Planning**

1. The District will initiate the development of mutually acceptable clinical instruction plans for using the Agency's clinical areas to meet the educational goals of Occupational Therapy Assistant Program curricula. These plans will be made available to the Agency at a mutually agreed upon time prior to the beginning of the school term and subject to revision in instances of conflicts with agency patient care responsibilities and/or District interests.
2. The District has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Agency staff, including both selected Agency personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating the educational program in occupational therapy.

**C. For Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Students**

1. The District will be responsible for assuring that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness, and shall provide certification that the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have been immunized against the common communicable diseases.

**PART III. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE AGENCY**

**A. For the Program in General**

1. The Agency will maintain the standards, which make it eligible for approval as a clinical area for instruction in accredited Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs. To further this, the Agency agrees to provide and maintain personnel who are in its opinion, capable and qualified in those divisions in which students are placed.
2. The administration of the service and patient care at the Agency shall be the responsibility of and under the control and supervision of the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency staff.
3. The Agency will designate a staff member who will function as Education Coordinator for Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education uses of the Agency facilities, including joint planning and representatives of all involved Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs.
4. The Agency will provide orientation for students and faculty to familiarize them with Agency policies and facilities before assigning them to duties at the Agency.

5. The Agency will permit its employees to participate in the educational program as resource persons and clinical experts provided such participation does not interfere with assigned duties.
6. The Agency will permit the faculty and students of the District to use its patient care and patient service facilities for clinical education according to approved curricula.
7. The Agency will confer with the District prior to making a commitment for new or expanded use of its clinical facilities by any other Occupational Therapy Assistant Program that interfere with current student placement.

**B. For Services and Facilities**

1. The Agency will permit the educational use of such supplies and equipment as are commonly available for patient care.
2. The Agency will permit use of the following facilities and services by District Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students and faculty at such times and to the degrees considered feasible by the agency.
  - a. Parking areas.
  - b. Locker, storage and dressing facilities.
  - c. Same food services as are available for Agency staff.
  - d. First aid treatment with written consent required for minors.
  - e. Access to sources of information for education purposes such as:
    1. Patient's chart.
    2. Procedure guides policy manuals.
    3. Medical dictionaries, pharmacology references, and other references suitable to the clinical area.
    4. Books and periodicals in the Medical library.

**C. For the Control of District Personnel**

1. The Agency may refuse access to its clinical areas to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students or district faculty who do not meet its employee standards for safety, health, cooperation, or ethical behavior pending investigation and resolution of the matter by the Agency and the District.

**PART IV. JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES**

**A. For publications**

1. Publication by District faculty, or Agency staff members of any material relative to their clinical experience, that has not been approved for release by the District and Agency signers of this agreement, is prohibited.

B. Insurance:

**Insurance Carried by the District.** District agrees to maintain in full force and effect coverage of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate for bodily injury, contractual liability and general liability insurance, including errors and omissions coverage which protects and insures against any and all liability attributable to the District, its employees, students, agents, officers, Board Members, and others arising from the activities required under this agreement and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. District shall provide workers' compensation coverage for its staff and students participating in this program. Proof of insurance is to be provided to Clinical Facility.

**Insurance Carried by Clinical Facility.** Clinical Facility agrees to maintain in full force and effect coverage of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate for bodily injury, contractual liability and general liability insurance, including errors and omissions coverage which protects and insures against any and all liability attributable to the Clinical Facility, its employees, agents, officers, Board Members, and others arising from the activities required under this agreement and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Proof of insurance is to be provided to District.

C. Indemnification

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, students and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, students or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

PART V. **STATUS OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT STUDENTS**

- A. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall have the status as learners and shall not be considered to be Agency employees nor shall they replace Agency staff. Any service rendered by the student during the experience is to be considered in addition to planned patient care in that area. Clinical experience will be conducted as a laboratory learning experience. The Agency will provide regular staffing for patient care in areas where students are obtaining clinical experience.
- B. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students are subject to the authority, policies, and regulations of the district. They are also subject, during clinical assignment, to applicable agency regulations and must conform to the same standards as are for Agency employees in matters relating to the welfare of patients and general Agency operations.

- C. The District will be responsible for assuring that health care students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness.

**PART VI. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, TERMINATION**

- A. This agreement shall be effective as of the date signed, and shall continue in effect for five years, unless terminated earlier by written notice of either party. Either party to this Agreement may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party at least 30 days' prior written notice. In the event the Agreement is terminated for cause, all of the obligations of the terminating party shall be waived immediately upon written notice of termination. In the event of termination without cause, the parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations associated with the current term or semester, prior to such termination becoming effective.

**BACKGROUND**

Proyecta 100,000 will increase cultural and educational exchange between Mexico and the U.S. in general, with a goal to substantially increase the number of Mexican students attending both Santa Ana College and Santiago Canyon College.


**ANALYSIS**

The contract with Extended Stay America is to provide housing for the 50 International students from Mexico. The agreement covers the period of Sunday, October 23, 2016 through Saturday, November 19, 2016, for a total of 27 nights. Execution of this agreement is essential to carrying out the terms of the Proyecta 100, which we fully support. The **fiscal impact** of the agreement, to be paid from the grant, is \$26,963.28 for each college for a total of \$53,926.56.

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

**BACKGROUND**

Attached are lists comparing degrees and certificates earned for Spring 2015 and Spring 2016. A list of Intersession 2016 degrees and certificates is included as well. Also attached, please find a list of students who have completed coursework at Santa Ana College leading to the Associate Degree and/or Certificate for Intersession and Spring 2016.

**ANALYSIS**

Santa Ana College awarded a total of 1,465 Associate Degrees at the conclusion of the Spring 2016 semester. Of the total number of degrees awarded, 793 were AA's, 266 AS's, 183 AAT's, and 223 AST's. The number of degrees awarded Spring 2016 represent an increase of 208 degrees over the total number of degrees awarded Spring 2015 of which a total of 1,257 Associate Degrees were conferred. The area with the most significant increase was Business Administration for Transfer which grew from 83 degrees awarded in Spring 2015 to a total of 125 degrees awarded in Spring 2016. Santa Ana College also awarded a total of 90 Associate Degrees during Intersession. Of the total number of degrees awarded during Intersession, 58 were AA's, 17 AS's, 7 AAT's, and 8 AST's.

Santa Ana College awarded 1,492 Certificates of Achievement (CA) at the conclusion of the Spring 2016 semester. This represents an increase of 489 certificates over Spring 2015 of which 1,003 Certificates of Achievement were conferred. The area with the most significant increase in certificates was Medical Assistant – Administrative/Clinical which awarded 161 certificates. Santa Ana College awarded 83 Certificates of Achievement during Intersession 2016.





**BACKGROUND**

On September 14, 2015 the Rancho Santiago Community College District (RSCCD) Board of Trustees approved amendments to its' Conflict of Interest Code as required by Government Code Section 87300 of the Political Reform Act of 1974. Pursuant to Government Code Section 87306.5(b), the Orange County Board of Supervisors, as the code reviewing body for the District, has requested that the RSCCD conduct a review of its' Conflict of Interest Code and, if a change in the Code is necessitated by changed circumstances, submit an amended Code to the County. Also, the County requested that districts use their disclosure category definitions. The amended Code will become effective upon approval by the County Board of Supervisors.

**ANALYSIS**

Consistent with the advisory opinions issued by the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC), the District's existing Conflict of Interest Code (Exhibit A) is revised to reflect officials or employees in the positions listed in Exhibit B. Those listed in Exhibit B shall file Statements of Economic Interest with the Orange County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors by electronic submission. Exhibit B includes updated, deleted and new job titles identified as positions required to file. The attached Resolution and Conflict of Interest Code have been reviewed and accepted, as is, by the Office of the Clerk of the Board.

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt Resolution No. 16-22 - Conflict of Interest Code as presented.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. The terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730 (Attachment A) and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference and, together with Exhibits A and B in which members and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of Rancho Santiago Community College District.

Section 2. The provisions of all Conflict of Interest Codes and Amendments thereto previously adopted by Rancho Santiago Community College District and hereby superseded.

Section 3. The Filing Officer, the Vice Chancellor of Business Operations/Fiscal Services, or his designee, is hereby authorized to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Clerk of the Orange County Board of Supervisors for review and approval by the Orange County Board of Supervisors as required by California Government Code Section 87303.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rancho Santiago Community College District hereby adopts Resolution 16-22 adopting a Conflict of Interest Code which supercedes all prior Conflict of Interest Codes and Amendments previously adopted.

**BACKGROUND**

In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Sections 58305(d), the District shall submit a copy of its Annual Budget and Financial Report (CCFS-311) to the Chancellor's Office by October 10<sup>th</sup> of each year. Furthermore, in accordance with Article XIII B to the State Constitution, limitations on expenditures are placed on State and local governments in the form of what is known as the Gann Appropriations Limit.

**ANALYSIS**

A copy of the CCFS-311 report has been provided for your review. The CCFS-311 report is divided into three parts: Current Expense of Education which is used to calculate the 50 Percent Law (our District is in compliance at 52.55% for 2015-16); Combined Balance Sheet information for all District funds; and other Supplemental Data including Details of General Fund Revenue, General Fund Expenditures by Activity, the Gann Appropriations Limit (Historically, our district has never met or been close to meeting the appropriations limit), Revenues, Expenditures and Fund Balance Data for all district funds, the Interfund Transfer Report, the Receipt and Expenditures of Lottery Proceeds, Details of Education Protection Account (EPA) funds, and the Pension Costs Report which estimates future STRS and PERS costs through 2020-21.

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the 2015-16 CCFS-311 Annual Budget and Financial Report as presented pending any audit adjustments and establish the District's 2016-17 Gann Limit in the amount of \$254,675,700.

**BACKGROUND:**

This is an amendment to an existing agreement for additional services. On November 17, 2014 the Board of Trustees approved an agreement with Westberg+White, Inc. to provide Architectural and Engineering Services for the Central Plant Project at Santa Ana College. The District is in need of additional services in order for the engineers to prepare additional plan check documents for the City of Santa Ana. Due to an additional back flow device requested by the City to be placed on district property, there is a need for additional engineering documents related to the sewer point of connection. The City requires additional plan check documents allowed through an encroachment permit to the City's sewer easement, connecting to the existing City vault along Bristol Avenue. Southern California Edison (SCE) also requested a new conduit run be brought into campus from Bristol Street along Campus Road that now needs further City plan review. Additionally, a metal panel manufacturer for the Central Plant building has discontinued the metal panels that were decorative features attached to the building. The architect and district recommend that this be replaced with a stucco finish. This change is undergoing redesign which needs a Bulletin be prepared for DSA in order for additional structural plan review to occur and approval prior to the contractor proceeding with work.

**ANALYSIS:**

The purpose of these additional services is to comply with new agency requirements requested during construction and for design changes as a result of unforeseen conditions. This amendment will allow Westberg+White to prepare the documents the City is requiring for the sewer and domestic water points of connection as well as submit the Bulletin to DSA for review and approval to not cause further delays to the project.

This is the third amendment to the contract as per attached summary of agreement and is for additional scope of work not in the original contract. The District has reviewed the scope of work required hours and tasks and found the added service fee to be fair, reasonable and within industry standards. The additional services covered by this amendment are for a not-to-exceed amount of \$65,000. The revised total contract amount is \$4,194,500. The contract duration for this agreement remains through January 31, 2018.

This agreement is funded by Measure Q.

**BACKGROUND**

In the event of a widespread emergency the ability to effectively communicate is vital. The existing analog handheld radios used throughout the District are antiquated and fail to meet the minimum functionality requirements of the District’s Safety and Security officers. As part of the design of a new District-wide radio communication system, the purchase replacement of handheld radios and system components are needed.

The Board of Trustees of the Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) has recently approved and awarded Bid 15-16 to Communications USA (Comm USA) for the purchase of handheld radios and accessories. This bid allows other public agencies including community college districts to piggyback under the same terms and conditions. In order to utilize this competitive price contract, our Board must take action to approve the use of this bid.

**ANALYSIS**

Board approval allows our District to purchase identical handheld radios and accessories. In addition to the radios, the contract includes system components such as repeaters and multi-unit radio charges. The equipment purchased under this contract will be incorporated into the design of the new system.

The contract meets all legal requirements including language allowing utilization by school and community college districts to piggyback. The contract period is for one year beginning July 26, 2016 through July 25, 2017 renewable annually for a period not to exceed three years.

Attached is the initial purchase proposal of fifty (50) radios and excerpts related to SAUSD’s bid; the remaining pages are available for review in the Purchasing Department.

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the use of SAUSD Bid No. 15-16 including renewals with Communications USA (Comm USA), for the purchase of handheld radios and accessories on an as needed basis as presented.



**GRANT SUB-AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

This grant sub-agreement (hereinafter “Agreement”) is entered into on this 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 2016, between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter “RSCCD”) and South Orange County Community College District (hereinafter “SUBCONTRACTOR”), on behalf of Irvine Valley College. RSCCD and SUBCONTRACTOR may be referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties” in this Agreement.

WHEREAS, RSCCD received a grant award entitled, “Global Trade & Logistics Deputy Sector Navigator, SB 858” Prime Award #15-157-008 (hereinafter “Grant”), from the California Community Colleges Chancellor’s Office (hereinafter “PRIME SPONSOR”), Workforce and Economic Development Division, to support projects at local community colleges and promote partnerships that will build on existing regional structures in Career Technical Education secondary and postsecondary education, to improve programs, to produce a skilled workforce, and to establish career pathways in support of the regional economy and the Global Trade & Logistics industry sector.

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, SUBCONTRACTOR has agreed to participate in the purpose of the Grant according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

**ARTICLE I**

1. **Statement of Work**

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to implement the “*2016 Externship for Orange County CTE Educators: Global Trade & Logistics*” project and perform the work as described in the Scope of Work (*Exhibit A*), which by reference is incorporated into this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work as set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Statement of Work in a professional, timely and diligent manner.

2. **Period of Performance**

The period of performance for this Agreement shall be from October 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.

3. **Total Cost**

The total cost to RSCCD for performance of this Agreement shall not exceed \$8,601.00 USD.

4. Budget

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that the expenditures of any and all funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the Project Budget (*Exhibit B*), which by reference is incorporated into this Agreement.

5. Payment

Fifty percent (50%) of the total cost will be issued to SUBCONTRACTOR upon RSCCD's receipt of the fully executed Agreement and an invoice for that disbursement. RSCCD shall make reimbursement payments as long as the total payments under this Agreement do not exceed the amount listed above under Article I.3. "Total Costs".

6. Invoices

Invoices must be itemized, include the Agreement number (refer to footer), and include back-up documentation for expenditures submitted for payment. Final payment is contingent upon successful completion of the Scope of Work (*Exhibit A*), upon receipt of a final invoice requesting payment due by **January 13, 2017**, and the Deputy Sector Navigator's certification of the final report. Through this Agreement, SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to provide data and submit reports, upon request, for the duration of the Grant. 8. Expenditure of Grant Funds

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all Grant requirements and that it is solely responsible for the appropriate expenditure of all Grant funds received and for any misappropriation or dis-allowment of Grant funds.

9. Time Extensions

RSCCD will not be requesting a time extension for program activities from the PRIME SPONSOR. As a result, SUBCONTRACTOR will not be granted an extension. Therefore, SUBCONTRACTOR must spend all of the funds allocated through this Agreement within the timeframe of the Agreement. **Narrative:**

In today's rapidly changing and highly competitive global economy, educators need to equip students with the tools necessary to thrive in an ever-shifting and volatile economic landscape. Yet, before educators can teach, they themselves must be equipped with knowledge on emerging high-wage, high-growth industries, workplace practices, skills requirements and career opportunities. In Orange County, four emerging industries promise high-wage and high-growth opportunities. These four cross-cutting clusters generated 280,000 jobs across 12 different industry clusters and paid wages that are nearly \$22,000 above the overall average. International Trade and Logistics is one of the critical emerging industries with average annual wages of \$77,758, and it is the focus of this grant project proposal. (Source: *Orange County Workforce Indicators 2015-16*).

Due to Orange County's geographic proximity to the ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles – not to mention, its well-developed road system, rail lines and airports –international trade plays a very important role. Los Angeles-Long Beach-Santa Ana ranks third in the nation for merchandise export volume, and exports generate approximately 13% of OC's gross metropolitan product. **GRANT SUB-AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

This grant sub-agreement (hereinafter “Agreement”) is entered into on this 26th day of September, 2016, between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter “RSCCD”) and IDMLOCO (hereinafter “SUBCONTRACTOR”). 15. Termination

Either Party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other Party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon termination, or notice thereof, the Parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of contract responsibilities, records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBCONTRACTOR expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect. **GRANT SUB-AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT  
AND  
LEGAL ENTITY**

This grant sub-agreement (hereinafter “Agreement”) is entered into on this 12<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2016, between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter “RSCCD”) and LEGAL ENTITY (hereinafter “SUBCONTRACTOR”), on behalf of the NAME OF COLLEGE. RSCCD and SUBCONTRACTOR may be referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties” in this Agreement.

WHEREAS, RSCCD was selected to serve as the Fiscal Agent for the “CTE Data Unlocked Initiative,” Prime Award #15-197-001 (hereinafter “Grant”), from the California Community Colleges Chancellor’s Office (hereinafter “PRIME SPONSOR”), Workforce and Economic Development Division, to support CTE program development and improvement efforts by providing a suite of tools, training, technical assistance and outcome and labor market data for the California community colleges.

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, SUBCONTRACTOR has agreed to participate in the purpose of the Grant according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

**ARTICLE I**

1. Statement of Work

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to perform the work as described in the Scope of Work (*Exhibit A*), which by reference is incorporated into this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work as set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Statement of Work in a professional, timely and diligent manner.

2. Period of Performance

The period of performance for this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2016 through October 31, 2017. The end date listed for the period of performance indicates the end of the Agreement between RSCCD and SUBCONTRACTOR. However, the PRIME SPONSOR allows the SUBCONTRACTOR to continue to use funds to achieve the college’s goals for CTE data management and capacity development for three years from the project start date.

3. Total Cost

The total cost to RSCCD for performance of this Agreement shall not exceed \$50,000.00 USD.

4. Budget

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that expenditure of funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the Scope of Work (*Exhibit A*) submitted by the SUBCONTRACTOR and approved by the PRIME SPONSOR and/or RSCCD, as appropriate, which by reference is incorporated into this Agreement. Modifications to the budget are allowed without prior approval, as long as the total dollar amount is not affected and the outcomes of the Agreement will not be materially affected.

5. Payment

A one-time payment of the total cost will be issued to SUBCONTRACTOR upon RSCCD's receipt of the fully executed Agreement and an invoice for payment. Payment to the SUBCONTRACTOR will not exceed the amount listed above under Article I.3. Total Cost.

6. Invoices

One invoice is to be submitted for payment for the total cost of the Agreement. The invoice must include the Agreement number (refer to footer), and should be submitted to the following address:

7. Reporting

Through this Agreement SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to provide data and submit reports, if requested and required by the PRIME SPONSOR. SUBCONTRACTOR will provide this information to RSCCD in a timely manner.

8. Expenditure of Grant Funds

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all Grant requirements and that it is solely responsible for the appropriate expenditure of all Grant funds received and for any misappropriation or dis-allowment of Grant funds.

9. Independent Contractor

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that the service provided hereunder are rendered in its capacity as an independent contractor and that it is not in any way an agent of RSCCD, nor shall its employees be entitled to any personnel benefits of RSCCD whatsoever.

10. Subcontract Assignment

No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBCONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR shall ensure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with state guidelines. Upon request, SUBCONTRACTOR shall submit to RSCCD copies of all subcontracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval that relate to this Agreement.

11. Record Keeping

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to maintain project records for possible audit for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment or until any audit findings have been resolved, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated.

12. Audit

SUBCONTRACTOR agrees that RSCCD, the PRIME SPONSOR, the Bureau of State Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s), shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to include a similar right of RSCCD, the PRIME SPONSOR, the Bureau of State Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s) to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to the performance of this Agreement.

13. Mutual Indemnification

Both Parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other Party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying Party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

14. Termination

Either Party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other Party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon termination, or notice thereof, the Parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of contract responsibilities, records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBCONTRACTOR expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, RSCCD shall provide SUBCONTRACTOR with written notification of such determination.

15. Disputes

In the event of a dispute between the Parties, the aggrieved Party shall notify the other Party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The Parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event

such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the Parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement shall be decided by RSCCD and/or the PRIME SPONSOR. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBCONTRACTOR. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, RSCCD receives from SUBCONTRACTOR a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBCONTRACTOR shall act in accordance with the written decision of RSCCD or the PRIME SPONSOR, whichever is the final arbiter of the dispute. The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by the State of California, and/or the PRIME SPONSOR, whichever is applicable, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations.

**Resolution No. 16-23**

**WHEREAS**, during the Great Recession, California schools and community colleges lost more than 30,000 certificated employees and thousands of classified employees to layoffs due to revenue loss;

**WHEREAS**, community colleges cut classes, laid off faculty and staff, and increased their tuitions and fees, pricing higher education out of the reach of many working families; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rancho Santiago Community College District’s ability to offer the best quality education possible suffered greatly during this period;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 30 has made an essential difference between the massive layoffs and program cuts community colleges experienced during the Great Recession;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 30 has allowed for the growth and restoration of many programs since its passage in Fiscal Year 2012;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 30 is a temporary tax, made up of two portions: (1) a sales tax increase of one quarter of one percent, thereby raising revenue; and (2) an income tax increase on wealthy individuals that make at least \$250,000 per year or families that make at least \$500,000 per year;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 30 has raised billions of dollars in revenue through these two components;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 30 sales tax revenues sunset in 2016, and the income tax revenues on high income earners expires in 2018;

**WHEREAS**, if Proposition 30 revenues are allowed to expire, even in a recovering economy, a great loss for community colleges, such as the Rancho Santiago Community College District, will be inevitable;

**WHEREAS**, if Proposition 30 revenues are allowed to expire, the budgets and financial stability of community colleges, such as Rancho Santiago Community College District, will return to pre-Proposition 30 conditions, forcing pay cuts, program cuts, and faculty layoffs;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 55 – the Children’s Education and Health Care Protection Act of 2016 would extend the temporary income tax increases on wealthy Californians for an additional twelve years, while allowing the sales tax provisions of Proposition 30 to expire;

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 55 – the Children’s Education and Health Care Protection Act of 2016 would extend the temporary income tax increases on wealthy Californians would make the extension of Proposition 30 revenues a progressive tax, paid for by taxpayers, for the benefit of public education;

**THEREFORE**, the Rancho Santiago Community College Board of Trustees supports California Proposition 55 – the Children’s Education and Health Care Protection Act of 2016.

6. **Transfer, Reassignment, or Title Change.** The Chancellor, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, may transfer or reassign Administrator to any position within the District for which Administrator is qualified, and may change the title of the Position, during the term of this Agreement, but there shall be no loss of compensation by Administrator due to such discretionary transfer, reassignment, or title change.

7. **Salary.** District shall pay an annual salary to Administrator in the amount of \$135,707.63 per academic year (July 1 through June 30), pro-rated if less than a full academic year, paid on a monthly basis. District reserves the right to increase the salary of Administrator during the term of this Agreement, but any such increase shall not be construed as an indication that this Agreement will be renewed or extended. Administrator agrees that District also reserves the right to decrease the salary of Administrator during the term of this Agreement as long as such decrease, on a percentage basis, is no more than what is implemented on a general basis for regular, full-time faculty of the District. Administrator is an exempt employee and is not eligible for overtime pay or compensatory time off.

8. **Work Year.** Administrator is a full-time employee of the District with a work year of 12 months per year. Administrator is entitled to be absent during District-designated holidays.

9. **Health and Welfare Benefits.** District shall provide Administrator with the same health and welfare benefits as currently approved or as subsequently modified by the Board of Trustees for all District administrators.

10. **Vacation.** Administrator shall accrue two and one-quarter vacation days for each month of service. Administrator may not accumulate more than 54 days of unused vacation as of July 1 of any academic year.

11. **Leaves.** Administrator shall be entitled to leaves of absence as provided by law or Board Policy, as may be amended from time-to-time.

12. **Teaching Assignments.** Subject to Board approval, and presuming that Administrator meets minimum qualifications, Administrator may serve as an instructor in no more than one class per semester for additional compensation, provided that such teaching does not impair Administrator's service in the Position.

13. **Professional Meetings and Activities.** Prior approval by the Chancellor shall be obtained for Administrator to attend any meeting or activity related to Administrator's employment in the Position. The reasonable and necessary expenses of attendance by Administrator at such a meeting or activity shall be paid by District only if approved by the Chancellor and the Board of Trustees.

14. **Evaluation.** Administrator shall be evaluated in writing at any time by Administrator's immediate supervisor, pursuant to Board Policy and procedures, utilizing established goals and objectives, self-assessments, the job description for the Position, and input from other employees.

15. **Retreat Rights.** If Administrator's first date of paid service was prior to July 1, 1990, Administrator's rights to faculty tenure are governed by the laws of the State of California

in effect as of June 30, 1990. The retreat rights for Administrator, if hired on or after July 1, 1990, and if Administrator does not have faculty tenure in the District, shall be in accordance with Section 87458 of the *Education Code*. Administrator has the responsibility to present the necessary transcripts and materials to District pursuant to Board policy and procedures in order to maintain any current faculty service area or acquire faculty service areas.

16. **Return to Tenured Faculty Position.** If Administrator has tenure in the District, and if Administrator has not been dismissed pursuant to Section 20 of this Agreement, then Administrator will be entitled to return to a tenured faculty position upon termination or expiration of this Agreement.

17. **Dismissal or Imposition of Penalties During the Term of this Agreement.** Pursuant to Section 72411.5 of the *Education Code*, if Administrator does not have faculty tenure in the District, then the grounds for dismissal or for imposition of penalties on Administrator during the term of this Agreement shall be dishonesty, insubordination, incompetence, unsatisfactory performance, unprofessional conduct, inability to perform, persistent or serious violation of law or of Board Policy or procedures, or any material and substantial breach of this Agreement. Administrator shall be entitled to due process protections as required by law.

18. **Dismissal or Imposition of Penalties During the Term of this Agreement If Tenured.** Pursuant to Section 72411.5 of the *Education Code*, if Administrator has faculty tenure in the District, then the grounds for dismissal or for imposition of penalties on Administrator during the term of this Agreement shall be in accordance with the statutory provisions applicable to tenured faculty members as set forth in Section 87732 of the *Education Code*. Administrator shall be entitled to due process protections as required by law.

19. **Resignation.** Administrator may resign from District employment at any time during the term of this Agreement upon 90 days prior written notice to the Board of Trustees, or upon a shorter period of time as may be approved by the Board of Trustees.

20. **Buy-Out of Agreement.** Pursuant to Section 53260 of the *Government Code*, except if District terminates this Agreement pursuant to Sections 17 or 18 of this Agreement, the maximum cash settlement that Administrator may receive shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of Administrator multiplied by the number of months left on the unexpired term of this Agreement. However, if the unexpired term of this Agreement is greater than 18 months, the maximum cash settlement shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of Administrator multiplied by 18. Any cash settlement shall not include any other non-cash items except health benefits which may be continued for the same duration of time as covered in the settlement or until Administrator finds other employment, whichever comes first. If the unexpired term is greater than 18 months, then the maximum time for continued health benefits paid for by District shall be 18 months.

21. **Medical Examination.** Upon request of the Board of Trustees or the Chancellor, Administrator agrees to undergo a comprehensive physical and/or psychiatric examination to determine if Administrator is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Position. The costs of any such examination shall be paid for by District. A confidential written report regarding any such examination shall be filed with the

Board of Trustees or the Chancellor indicating whether Administrator is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Position.

22. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is ruled to be contrary to law, all other provisions of this Agreement shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

23. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties. There are no terms, conditions, or oral understandings not contained in this Agreement.

24. **Amendment.** This Agreement may be modified or superseded only by a written amendment executed by both Parties.

25. **Mandatory Mediation and Arbitration.** Except as otherwise prohibited by law, the Parties agree that any dispute, claim, or controversy arising out of the Parties' employment relationship, including, but not limited to, alleged violations of federal, state, or local statutes, including those prohibiting harassment and discrimination, and any other claims, including alleged violations of any provisions of the *Education Code*, which cannot be resolved through informal and confidential discussions, shall be submitted to mediation, and if mediation is unsuccessful, to binding arbitration before a neutral Arbitrator. The mediator and any necessary Arbitrator shall be selected through Judicial Arbitration & Mediation Services/Endispute (JAMS). Attachment "A" to this Agreement sets forth the procedures to be utilized and is hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement as if fully set forth within. The Parties agree that they have carefully read Attachment "A," knowingly agree to all of its contents, and knowingly agree to the covenant to mediate and arbitrate all employment disputes contained in Attachment "A".

26. **Ratification.** The Parties agree that this Agreement is not binding or enforceable unless and until it is duly ratified by the Board of Trustees.
