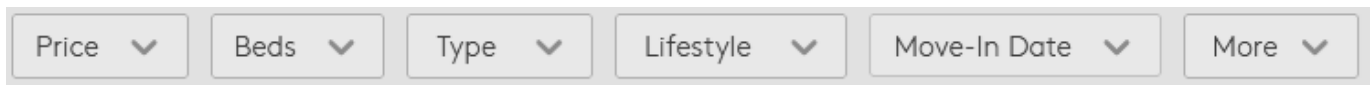
INTRODUCTION: Finding Housing
