What is CASAS test?	The CASAS test (Comprehensive Adult Student Assessment System) is a tool that helps us see how you're progressing in your classes. It's based on real-life skills and workplace needs , so it focuses on what adults need to know to be successful in everyday life and on the job.
Why do students have to take the CASAS test?	The State of California and the U.S. Department of Education require all students in ABE (Adult Basic Education) , ESL (English as a Second Language) , High School Subjects , and GED programs to take the CASAS test. This is part of a federal law called the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) , which makes sure that your progress in these programs is measured and supported.
How many times do students have to take CASAS test?	Most students take the CASAS test 2 to 5 times a year , depending on their scores. The testing period starts on July 1 and ends on June 30 each year. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tip: All new students need to go to D-101 for a pretest when they start.
How does the test result affect the students' grade?	The CASAS test results help track how you're doing in your program. Your teachers may use the results to see how you're improving in your classes. While the test scores don't directly change your grades, they help your instructors understand your progress and see what areas you might need extra support in.
What should I bring with me on test day?	Make sure to have your student ID with you if you have one, as it will make the check-in process easier. If you don't have a student ID, be prepared to provide your date of birth . Remember, no phones, dictionaries, or other electronic devices are allowed during the test.
