District Budget Update –committee discussed chancellor’s proposal to address possible \$8 million budget deficit for 2017-18. SCC Budget “informally recommended” to FRC that first \$4million in cuts come from stabilization fund, with remainder to come from reductions at colleges and district office. Recommendation expressed to FRC at next meeting by SCC reps.
